1 AN ACT Relating to the Lewis and Clark trail bicentennial 2 commemoration; and adding a new section to chapter 27.34 RCW.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 27.34 RCW 5 to read as follows:

6 (1) The Washington state historical society shall work with and 7 provide leadership to the Lewis and Clark trail committee in planning 8 activities to commemorate Lewis and Clark's epic exploration to the 9 northwest United States.

10 (2) The society shall coordinate its planning efforts with the 11 parks and recreation commission, which provides staffing and 12 administrative assistance to the Lewis and Clark trail committee.

13 (3) The society shall work with other associations and state 14 agencies to coordinate, develop, and disseminate information regarding 15 the planned activities.
