7 "NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** Pursuant to chapter 43.155 RCW, the  
8 following project loans recommended by the public works board are  
9 authorized to be made with funds previously appropriated from the  
10 public works assistance account:

- 11 (1) City of Blaine--sanitary sewer project--construct new grit channel,  
12 chlorine contact chambers, and chlorination/dechlorination facility and  
13 sludge dewatering equipment. Replacement of rotating biological  
14 contactors and secondary clarifiers with sequencing batch reactors  
15 . . . . . \$2,318,037
- 16 (2) City of Blaine--sanitary sewer project--replace sewer lines between  
17 peace portal drive and pump station no. 1 on Marine Drive, including  
18 nine manholes, curb and gutter removal, and roadway repair  
19 . . . . . \$593,365
- 20 (3) City of Bremerton--sanitary sewer project--separating the combined  
21 sewer and storm water drainage systems, separating roof drains, and  
22 other measures to reduce overflows . . . . . \$662,000
- 23 (4) City of Buckley--sanitary sewer project--reduce l/l problem by  
24 installing a sanitary sewer and storm pipe, conversion of existing  
25 sewer mains to storm water, and construction of an aerobic digester  
26 . . . . . \$1,200,000
- 27 (5) Covington Water District--domestic water project--provide  
28 facilities for dosing chemicals for disinfection and PH adjustment  
29 . . . . . \$1,596,000
- 30 (6) Grays Harbor County--sanitary sewer project--transitioning from  
31 failing individual on-site systems to and upgraded and expanding  
32 treatment facility with twenty-five mgd advanced secondary wastewater

- 34 (7) City of Ilwaco--sanitary sewer project--replacement of side sewer  
35 lines in two city sewer basins in order to meet department of health

18	(12) City of Quincy--road project--repair/replacement of damaged	
19	portions of curb, gutter, and sidewalk; consisting of grading, drainage	
20	improvements, crushed rock base, asphalt concrete pavement, curb and	
21	gutter, sidewalk, and illumination. Replacement of malfunctioning	
22	railroad crossing signal system . . . . .	\$449,995
23	(13) Town of Rosalia--domestic water project--construct a new three	
24	hundred thousand gallon water reservoir, replacement of an antiquated	
25	booster pump station . . . . .	\$216,900
26	(14) City of Seattle--bridge project--replace steel deck grating on the	
27	University and Fremont bridges, install truss protection railing, and	
28	rehabilitate the centerlock . . . . .	\$3,284,640
29	(15) City of Woodland--domestic water project--provide water collection	
30	laterals, transmission main, a new filtration plant with one hundred	
31	thousand gallon wet well storage, and filters that will enhance the

36        NEW SECTION.    **Sec. 2.**    An appropriation of \$25,000,000 for the  
37 biennium ending June 30, 1997, is hereby made from the public works  
38 assistance account to the department of community, trade, and economic

1 development for the purposes of providing funds for the following  
2 project loans recommended by the public works board:

3 (1) City of Blaine--sanitary sewer project--replace seventy-year-old  
4 sewer system with new sanitary sewers . . . . . \$332,700

5 (2) City of Bonney Lake--domestic water project--installation of a new  
6 two million gallon reservoir to meet department of health  
7 requirements . . . . . \$953,595

8 (3) Public Utility District No. 1 of Chelan County--domestic water--  
9 construction of a five hundred thousand gallon concrete reservoir and  
10 appurtenances, approximately two hundred lineal feet of eight-inch  
11 water main for connection to existing distribution system, and site  
12 restoration to comply with department of health requirements  
13 . . . . . \$390,950

14 (4) Coal Creek Utility District--domestic water project--replace  
15 approximately ten thousand six hundred lineal feet of water main and  
16 construct two water chlorination facilities . . . . . \$747,425

17 (5) Covington Water District--domestic water project--replace  
18 approximately twenty-three thousand five hundred lineal feet of leaky  
19 distribution service lines and connections at Timberlane Estates

26 generator, demolish and remove two fifty-five thousand gallon

30 lines on SE 48th, 328th Way SE, Preston-Fall City Road, also replace

34 approximately twenty-three thousand seven hundred fifty lineal feet of

8	(12) Olympic View Water and Sewer District--domestic water project--	
9	construct a new water filtration facility at Deer Creek for compliance	
10	with filtration and disinfection standards . . . . .	\$919,345
11	(13) City of Renton--domestic water project--construction of corrosion	
12	control treatment facilities to treat water from wells WW 1, 2, 3, 8,	
13	and 9 and Springbrook Springs . . . . .	\$932,600
14	(14) City of Seattle--bridge project--bridge columns and substructure	
15	of the South Spokane Street Viaduct will be strengthened by adding	
16	seismic jacketing to all existing columns, in addition to increasing	
17	the size of the viaduct's bridge girder seats . . . . .	\$456,885
18	(15) Southwest Suburban Sewer District--sanitary sewer project--replace	
19	and rehabilitate approximately eighteen thousand lineal feet of	
20	existing sanitary sewer lines, associated manholes, and side sewer	
21	connections in the Salmon Creek Drainage Basin . . . . .	\$2,100,000
22	(16) City of Spokane--bridge project--remove and replace two bridges in	
23	downtown Spokane including new water and sewer mains and a	
24	pedestrian/bicycle pathway . . . . .	\$4,000,000
25	(17) City of Spokane--domestic water project--replaces eighty-five-	
26	year-old water transmission and ductile mains, including valves and	
27	casing under a rail line, also pavement removal, restoration, and	
28	traffic control measures . . . . .	\$4,428,000
29	(18) City of University Place--road project--construct six-foot	
30	sidewalks, including handicap accessible curbs and gutters, and bicycle	
31	lanes on both sides of Grandview Drive. Also construct enclosed storm

33	(19) Val Vue Sewer District--sanitary sewer project--rehabilitation of	
34	approximately two thousand four hundred sixty-five lineal feet of

1       **Sec. 3.** RCW 43.155.060 and 1988 c 93 s 2 are each amended to read  
2 as follows:

3       In order to aid the financing of public works projects, the board  
4 may:

5       (1) Make low-interest or interest-free loans to local governments  
6 from the public works assistance account or other funds and accounts  
7 for the purpose of assisting local governments in financing public  
8 works projects. The board may require such terms and conditions and  
9 may charge such rates of interest on its loans as it deems necessary or  
10 convenient to carry out the purposes of this chapter. Money received  
11 from local governments in repayment of loans made under this section  
12 shall be paid into the public works assistance account for uses  
13 consistent with this chapter.

14       (2) Pledge money in the public works assistance account, or money  
15 to be received by the public works assistance account, to the repayment  
16 of all or a portion of the principal of or interest on obligations  
17 issued by local governments to finance public works projects. The  
18 board shall not pledge any amount greater than the sum of money in the  
19 public works assistance account plus money to be received from the  
20 payment of the debt service on loans made from that account, nor shall  
21 the board pledge the faith and credit or the taxing power of the state  
22 or any agency or subdivision thereof to the repayment of obligations  
23 issued by any local government.

24       (3) Create such subaccounts in the public works assistance account  
25 as the board deems necessary to carry out the purposes of this chapter.

26       (4) Provide a method for the allocation of loans and financing  
27 guarantees and the provision of technical assistance under this  
28 chapter.

29       The board shall ensure that at the beginning of each fiscal quarter  
30 there is a sufficient cash balance in the public works assistance  
31 account to cover the disbursements anticipated during the quarter.

32       All local public works projects aided in whole or in part under the  
33 provisions of this chapter shall be put out for competitive bids,  
34 except for emergency public works under RCW 43.155.065 for which the  
35 recipient jurisdiction shall comply with this requirement to the extent  
36 feasible and practicable. The competitive bids called for shall be  
37 administered in the same manner as all other public works projects put  
38 out for competitive bidding by the local governmental entity aided  
39 under this chapter.

1        NEW SECTION.    **Sec. 4.**    This act is necessary for the immediate  
2 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the  
3 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect  
4 immediately."
