## **SSB 6590**

As Passed Senate, February 16, 1998

**Title:** An act relating to driver's license examinations.

Brief Description: Revising provision for driver's license examinations.

**Sponsors:** Senate Committee on Transportation (originally sponsored by Senators Horn, Haugen and Wood; by request of Department of Licensing).

## SENATE COMMITTEE ON TRANSPORTATION

**Majority Report:** That Substitute Senate Bill No. 6590 be substituted therefor, and the substitute bill do pass.

**Background:** A person who holds a valid driver's license issued by another state is not required to take the driving portion of the driver's license examination in order to obtain a Washington driver's license. A person who holds a valid driver's license issued by a province of Canada, however, is required to take both the written and driving portion of the exam.

**Summary of Bill:** The Department of Licensing (DOL) is allowed to waive the driving portion of the license exam for persons who hold a valid driver's license issued by a province of Canada. DOL has determined that Canadian standards for licensing drivers are consistent with Washington State standards.

DOL is given authority to enter into formal agreements with other countries to waive the driving portion of the driver's license test provided that the agency has procedures in place to verify the validity of the foreign driver's license.

**Appropriation:** None.

**Fiscal Note:** Available.

**Effective Date:** Ninety days after adjournment of session in which bill is passed.

**Testimony For:** Passage of the bill would allow licensed Canadian drivers to drive in Washington without having to arrange for and take the driving portion of the driver's test.
