1 AN ACT Relating to identification; adding a new chapter to Title 19 2 RCW; and prescribing penalties.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. (1) Any person or entity, other than those <u>NEW SECTION.</u> 5 listed in subsection (2) of this section, issuing an identification card that purports to identify the holder as a resident of this or any б 7 other state and that contains at least a name, photograph, and date of birth, must label the card "not official proof of identification" in 8 flourescent yellow ink, on the face of the card, and in not less than 9 10 fourteen-point font. The background color of the card must be a color other than the color used for official Washington state driver's 11 licenses and identicards. 12

13 (2) This section does not apply to the following persons and 14 entities:

- 15 (a) Department of licensing;
- 16 (b) Any federal, state, or local government agency;
- 17 (c) The Washington state liquor control board;
- 18 (d) Private employers issuing cards identifying employees;

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(e) Banks and credit card companies issuing credit, debit, or bank
cards containing a person's photograph; and

3 (f) Retail or wholesale stores issuing membership cards containing4 a person's photograph.

5 (3) Failure to comply with this section is a class 1 civil 6 infraction.

7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. Section 1 of this act constitutes a new 8 chapter in Title 19 RCW.
