- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.44.034 and 1991 c 143 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) The load, or any portion of any vehicle, operated alone upon
- 7 the public highway of this state, or the load, or any portion of the
- 8 front vehicle of a combination of vehicles, shall not extend more than
- 9 three feet beyond the front wheels of such vehicle, or the front
- 10 bumper, if equipped with front bumper. This subsection does not apply
- 11 to a front-loading garbage truck or recycling truck while on route and
- 12 actually engaged in the collection of solid waste or recyclables at
- 13 speeds of twenty miles per hour or less.
- 14 (2) No vehicle shall be operated upon the public highways with any
- 15 part of the permanent structure or load extending in excess of fifteen
- 16 feet beyond the center of the last axle of such vehicle. This
- 17 subsection does not apply to "specialized equipment" designated under
- 18 49 U.S.C. (([Sec.])) <u>Sec.</u> 2311 that is operated on the interstate
- 19 highway system, those designated portions of the federal-aid primary

- 1 system, and routes constituting reasonable access from such highways to
- 2 terminals and facilities for food, fuel, repairs, and rest.
