- 6 Any information obtained by governmental agencies that is collected
- 7 by the use of a motor carrier intelligent transportation system or any
- 8 comparable information equipment attached to a truck, tractor, or
- 9 trailer is confidential and not subject to public disclosure under this
- 10 chapter. However, the information may be given to other governmental
- 11 agencies or the owners of the truck, tractor, or trailer from which the
- 12 information is obtained. As used in this section, "motor carrier" has
- 13 the same definition as provided in RCW 81.80.010.
