- 1 AN ACT Relating to veterans; and amending RCW 41.04.005.
- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 3 **Sec. 1.** RCW 41.04.005 and 1996 c 300 s 1 are each amended to read 4 as follows:
- 5 (1) As used in RCW 41.04.005, 41.16.220, and 41.20.050 "veteran"
- 6 includes every person, who at the time he or she seeks the benefits of
- 7 RCW 41.04.005, 41.04.010, 41.16.220, 41.20.050, 41.40.170, 73.04.110,
- 8 or 73.08.080 has received an honorable discharge or received a
- 9 discharge for physical reasons with an honorable record and who meets
- 10 at least one of the following criteria:
- 11 (a) The person has served between World War I and World War II or
- 12 during any period of war, as defined in subsection (2) of this section,
- 13 as either:
- 14 (i) A member in any branch of the armed forces of the United
- 15 States;
- 16 (ii) A member of the women's air forces service pilots;
- 17 (iii) A U.S. documented merchant mariner with service aboard an
- 18 oceangoing vessel operated by the war shipping administration, the
- 19 office of defense transportation, or their agents, ((during the period

- 3 (iv) A civil service crewmember with service aboard a U.S. army

- 6 December 7, 1941, to ((August 15, 1945)) <u>December 31, 1946</u>; or
- 7 (b) The person has received the armed forces expeditionary medal,

- 10 (i) In any branch of the armed forces of the United States; or
- 11 (ii) As a member of the women's air forces service pilots.
- 12 (2) A "period of war" includes:

- 15 (c) The Korean conflict;
- 16 (d) The Vietnam era, which was the period beginning August 5, 1964,
- 17 and ending on May 7, 1975;
- 18 (e) The Persian Gulf War, which was the period beginning August 2,
- 19 1990, and ending on the date prescribed by presidential proclamation or
- 20 law;
- 21 (f) The period beginning on the date of any future declaration of
- 22 war by the congress and ending on the date prescribed by presidential
- 23 proclamation or concurrent resolution of the congress; and
- 24 (g) The following armed conflicts, if the participant was awarded
- 25 the respective campaign badge or medal: The crisis in Lebanon; the
- 26 invasion of Grenada; Panama, Operation Just Cause; Somalia, Operation
- 27 Restore Hope; Haiti, Operation Uphold Democracy; and Bosnia, Operation
- 28 Joint Endeavor.
