3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 3.42.030 and 1984 c 258 s 32 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

Any party may have a case transferred from a district court 6 7 commissioner to a judge of the same district for hearing, by filing a motion for transfer as long as the motion is filed and called to the 8 attention of the commissioner before any discretionary ruling has been 9 10 made. The following are not considered discretionary rulings: (1) The arrangement of the calendar; (2) the setting of an action, motion, or 11 proceeding for hearing or trial; (3) the arraignment of the accused; or 12 13 (4) the fixing of bail. The commissioner shall forthwith transfer the 14 case to the judge.
