NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. The higher education coordinating board, in conjunction with the state board for community and technical colleges, the office of financial management, and the state institutions of higher education, shall study distance education in Washington state and shall produce and deliver to the legislature no later than January 8 2001, a study that:

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1 (1) Defines the different modes of distance education;

2 (2) Analyzes the impact of distance education on capital needs and3 facility utilization;

4 (3) Evaluates the impact of distance delivery on instruction and 5 faculty, as well as student support, technological support, and 6 administrative support services;

7 (4) Identifies obstacles in providing distance education 8 instruction;

9 (5) Analyzes the cost factors associated with the various distance 10 delivery modes;

11 (6) Assesses the role of the K-20 network in distance delivery;
