- 5 encourage the development of creative programs that streamline project
  - permit processes, reduce costs of program implementation, and increase
- 7 environmental benefits and compliance.

- 8 (2) The environmental affairs office of the department of
- 9 transportation, in coordination with the department of ecology, the
- 10 department of fish and wildlife, and representatives from cities and
- 11 counties, shall convene a work group to evaluate and assess existing
- 12 transportation certification programs for applicability to the
- 13 environmental permit streamlining process. The work group will
- 14 consider, but is not limited to, technical expertise requirements,
- 15 evaluation criteria, compliance mechanisms, monitoring requirements,
- 16 audit functions of external agencies, enforcement capacity, and
