1 AN ACT Relating to extending the expiration date of the enhanced 2 911 advisory committee; amending RCW 38.52.530; and providing an 3 expiration date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 38.52.530 and 1997 c 49 s 7 are each amended to read 6 as follows:

7 The enhanced 911 advisory committee is created to advise and assist the state enhanced 911 coordinator in coordinating and facilitating the 8 9 implementation and operation of enhanced 911 throughout the state. The 10 director shall appoint members of the committee who represent diverse geographical areas of the state and include state residents who are 11 12 members of the national emergency number association, the associated 13 public communications officers Washington chapter, the Washington state 14 fire chiefs association, the Washington association of sheriffs and 15 police chiefs, the Washington state council of fire fighters, the Washington state council of police officers, the Washington ambulance 16 17 association, the state fire protection policy board, the Washington 18 fire commissioners association, the Washington state patrol, the 19 association of Washington cities, the Washington state association of

- 1 counties, the utilities and transportation commission or commission
- 2 staff, and representatives of large and small local exchange telephone
- 3 companies. This section ((shall)) expires December 31, ((2000)) 2006.
