3 On page 3, after line 31, insert the following:

4 "(3)(a) Strikes by employees covered under this section are  
5 prohibited.

6 (b) For the purposes of this subsection, "strike" includes any  
7 concerted action by employees or employee organizations to suspend,  
8 curtail, interrupt, withhold, or otherwise fail or refuse to perform  
9 fully their normal duties or services as employees in connection with  
10 a controversy concerning terms or conditions of their public  
11 employment, or concerning the association or representation of persons  
12 in negotiating, fixing, maintaining, changing, or seeking to arrange  
13 terms or conditions of their public employment, regardless of whether  
14 the disputants in the controversy stand in the proximate relation of  
15 employer and employee. A strike includes, but is not limited to, any  
16 concerted action that would result in delaying the determination of  
17 student grades or that would impair a student's eligibility to graduate  
18 because of the failure to perform normal duties.

19 (c) If, upon the motion of a student or student's parent, faculty  
20 member, or the employer, a court finds that as a result of a strike  
21 student grades are unreasonably delayed or that a student's eligibility  
22 to graduate is impaired because of a delayed transcript, the court  
23 shall impose a civil penalty of one thousand dollars for each day of  
24 the delay to be paid by the exclusive bargaining representative of the  
25 bargaining unit that engaged in a strike."

**EFFECT:** Adds that strikes by covered student employees are prohibited and adds a definition of strike that includes any concerted action by employees who fail to perform their normal duties fully, including actions that result in delaying student grades or impairing student graduation. A court must impose a \$1,000 penalty for each day of delay, to be paid by the exclusive bargaining representative.
