11 On page 3, after line 4 of the amendment, insert the following:

12 "(2)(a) The retailer making the sale of a sterile hypodermic
13 syringe or hypodermic needle for the purpose of reducing bloodborne
14 diseases is responsible for recording the required information in a
15 register book as provided in (c) of this subsection. The retailer may
16 not sell a sterile hypodermic syringe or hypodermic needle for the
17 purpose of reducing bloodborne disease to a person under age eighteen
18 and must require the purchaser to supply identification so that the
19 purchaser's true name, address, and age can be verified. The retailer
20 must keep the hypodermic syringes and hypodermic needles in a safe
21 place that is not accessible to members of the public. A retailer is
22 required to show every purchaser of a sterile hypodermic syringe or
23 hypodermic needle a copy of the law related to these requirements.

24 (b) No person may obtain sterile hypodermic syringes or hypodermic
25 needles for the purpose of reducing bloodborne diseases unless:

26 (i) The syringes or needles are purchased for the purpose of
27 reducing bloodborne diseases;

28 (ii) The purchaser is at least eighteen years old; and

29 (iii) The purchaser signs the register book for sterile hypodermic
30 syringes or hypodermic needles with his or her true name and address
31 and supplies proof of identification.

32 (c)(i) Every retailer handling sterile hypodermic syringes or
33 hypodermic needles must keep a hypodermic syringe and hypodermic needle

1 register book in which the following statement must appear at the top
2 of each page: This is my true name, birthdate, and address.

3 (ii) All sales of hypodermic syringes and hypodermic needles to
4 reduce bloodborne diseases without a practitioner's prescription must
5 be recorded in the hypodermic syringe and hypodermic needle register
6 book and the following information must be recorded therein:

7 (A) The printed name of the purchaser;

8 (B) The signature of the purchaser;

9 (C) The address of the purchaser;

10 (D) The birthdate of the purchaser;

11 (E) The quantity of sterile hypodermic syringes and hypodermic
12 needles sold to the purchaser;

13 (F) The date of the sale;

14 (G) The initials or name of the retailer who sold the hypodermic
15 syringes or hypodermic needles; and

16 (H) Proof of identification. This includes a driver's license or
17 other state or federally issued photo identification card that has a
18 unique identification number.

19 (iii) All register books used to record the sale of hypodermic
20 syringes and hypodermic needles must conform to the following
21 standards:

22 (A) The book must be eight and one-half inches wide and eleven
23 inches long;

24 (B) The book must be securely bound, not loose leaf or spiral
25 bound;

26 (C) The book must have its pages consecutively numbered with a
27 unique number assigned to each book and identified on each page; and

28 (D) Each page must consist of an original and duplicate. If any
29 sales are recorded, the duplicate sheet must be mailed to the
30 Washington state board of pharmacy when completed or on the last day of
31 each month, whichever is earlier.

32 (d) All pharmacy records relating to hypodermic syringes and
33 hypodermic needles are open to examination by the Washington state
34 board of pharmacy investigators during normal business hours. The
35 refusal to permit such an examination constitutes grounds for the
36 suspension or revocation of a pharmacist's license."

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
