3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 28A.310.170 and 1985 c 341 s 7 are each amended to 5 read as follows:

6 (1) Every educational service district board shall employ and set 7 the salary of an educational service district superintendent who shall 8 be employed by a written contract for a term to be fixed by the board, 9 but not to exceed three years, and who may be discharged for sufficient 10 cause.

(2) There is hereby established within each educational service 11 district an educational service district 12 superintendent review 13 committee. Such review committee shall be composed of <u>a subcommittee</u> 14 of the board, two school district superintendents from within the 15 educational service district selected by the educational service district board, and a representative of the state superintendent of 16 17 public instruction selected by the state superintendent of public instruction. 18

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(3) Prior to the employment by the educational service district 1 board of a new educational service district superintendent, the review 2 screen all applicants against the established 3 committee shall 4 qualifications for the position and recommend to the board a list of three <u>or more</u> candidates. The educational service district board shall 5 either select the new superintendent from the list of three or more б candidates ((or shall)), ask the review committee to add additional 7 8 names to the list, or reject the entire list and ((request)) ask the 9 review committee to submit three <u>or more</u> additional candidates((, and)) for consideration. The educational service district board shall repeat 10 this process until a superintendent is selected. 11 Passed the House March 9, 2001.
