- 1 AN ACT Relating to emergent needs; adding a new section to chapter
- 2 38.52 RCW; creating a new section; making appropriations; and declaring
- 3 an emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature declares an emergency caused
- 6 by a natural disaster, known as the Nisqually earthquake, which
- 7 occurred on February 28, 2001, as proclaimed by the governor and the
- 8 president of the United States.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 38.52 RCW
- 10 to read as follows:
- 11 The Nisqually earthquake account is created in the state treasury.
- 12 Moneys may be placed in the account from tax revenues, budget transfers
- 13 or appropriations, federal appropriations, gifts, or any other lawful
- 14 source. Moneys in the account may be spent only after appropriation.
- 15 Moneys in the account shall be used only to support state and local
- 16 government disaster response and recovery efforts associated with the
- 17 Nisqually earthquake.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** The sum of one million dollars is
- 2 appropriated from the emergency reserve fund to the state military
- 3 department for deposit into the Nisqually earthquake account.
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** One million dollars of the Nisqually
- 5 earthquake account--state, representing the state share, and three
- 6 million dollars of the Nisqually earthquake account--federal,
- 7 representing the federal share, are appropriated to the state military
- 8 department for response and recovery costs associated with the
- 9 Nisqually earthquake.
- 10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** (1) The legislature declares an emergency
- 11 for energy for low-income households.
- 12 (2) The sum of one million dollars, or as much thereof as may be
- 13 necessary, is appropriated from the emergency reserve fund to the
- 14 department of community, trade, and economic development for the fiscal
- 15 year ending June 30, 2001, for energy assistance under the low-income
- 16 home energy assistance program.
- 17 (3) The sum of four million dollars, or as much thereof as may be
- 18 necessary, is appropriated from the general fund--federal to the
- 19 department of community, trade, and economic development for the fiscal
- 20 year ending June 30, 2001, for energy assistance under the low-income
- 21 home energy assistance program.
- 22 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 23 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 24 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
- 25 immediately.
