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- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The sum of five million dollars is
- 5 appropriated for the biennium ending June 30, 2003, from the emergency
 - reserve fund for deposit in the state drought preparedness account in
- 7 response to the emergency caused by a natural disaster and declared a
- 8 statewide drought emergency by the governor on March 14, 2001.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** The sum of twenty million dollars is
- 10 appropriated for the biennium ending June 30, 2003, from the emergency
- 11 reserve fund for deposit in the Nisqually earthquake account in
- 12 response to the emergency caused by a natural disaster, known as the
- 13 Nisqually earthquake, as declared by chapter 5, Laws of 2001, the
- 14 governor, and the president of the United States.
- 15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 16 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the

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- 1 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
- 2 immediately.
