11 appropriations for the job creation and infrastructure program: (1)  
12 Agencies shall contract permitting, design, and construction services  
13 wherever appropriate; (2) agencies shall coordinate contract and  
14 project management services to meet the completion goals of this  
15 section; (3) agencies may petition the office of financial management  
16 to use agency staff or to separately contract project management  
17 services for individual projects on an exception basis by demonstrating  
18 that this approach is more cost effective and necessary to meet the  
19 timeline goals in this section; and (4) to carry out the provisions of  
20 sections 201 through 227 of this act, the office of financial  
21 management may assign responsibility for design, construction, and  
22 other related activities to any appropriate agency.

23       NEW SECTION.    **Sec. 227.** To ensure that job creation and  
24 infrastructure program appropriations are carried out in accordance  
25 with legislative intent, funds shall not be allotted until eligible  
26 projects are approved by and on file with the office of financial  
27 management. Allotments for appropriations shall be provided for each  
28 eligible project in accordance with the capital project review  
29 requirements adopted by the office of financial management. No  
30 expenditure may be incurred or obligation assumed against job creation  
31 and infrastructure program appropriations until the office of financial  
32 management has approved the allotment of the funds to be expended.

33       The office of financial management is expected to monitor the  
34 progress of eligible projects that receive appropriations. No later  
35 than December 1, 2002, the office of financial management shall report  
36 the following information to the capital budget committee of the house  
37 of representatives and the ways and means committee of the senate: (1)

1 A status report on each project noting percent completion; and (2) an  
2 explanation of why any appropriation remains unexpended. Agencies

7 **NEW SECTION. Sec. 301. FOR THE STATE TREASURER--TRANSFERS**

8 For transfers in this section to the state general fund, pursuant  
9 to RCW 43.135.035(5), the state expenditure limit shall be increased by  
10 the amount of the transfer. The increase shall occur in fiscal year  
11 2002.

17 **Sec. 302.** RCW 28B.30.730 and 1991 sp.s. c 13 s 50 are each amended  
18 to read as follows:

19 For the purpose of financing the cost of any projects, the board is  
20 hereby authorized to adopt the resolution or resolutions and prepare  
21 all other documents necessary for the issuance, sale and delivery of  
22 the bonds or any part thereof at such time or times as it shall deem  
23 necessary and advisable. Said bonds:

- 24 (1) Shall not constitute
- 25 (a) An obligation, either general or special, of the state; or
- 26 (b) A general obligation of Washington State University or of the  
27 board;
- 28 (2) Shall be
- 29 (a) Either registered or in coupon form; and
- 30 (b) Issued in denominations of not less than one hundred dollars;  
31 and
- 32 (c) Fully negotiable instruments under the laws of this state; and
- 33 (d) Signed on behalf of the university by the president of the  
34 board, attested by the secretary or the treasurer of the board, have  
35 the seal of the university impressed thereon or a facsimile of such

1 coupons attached thereto shall be signed with the facsimile signatures  
2 of such president and secretary;

3 (3) Shall state

4 (a) The date of issue; and

5 (b) The series of the issue and be consecutively numbered within  
6 the series; and

7 (c) That the bond is payable both principal and interest solely out  
8 of the bond retirement fund;

9 (4) Each series of bonds shall bear interest, payable either  
10 annually or semiannually, as the board may determine;

11 (5) Shall be payable both principal and interest out of the bond  
12 retirement fund;

13 (6) Shall be payable at such times over a period of not to exceed  
14 forty years from date of issuance, at such place or places, and with  
15 such reserved rights of prior redemption, as the board may prescribe;

16 (7) Shall be sold in such manner and at such price as the board may  
17 prescribe;

18 (8) Shall be issued under and subject to such terms, conditions and  
19 covenants providing for the payment of the principal thereof and  
20 interest thereon and such other terms, conditions, covenants and

37 Washington State University building account to the bond retirement  
38 account when ordered by the board of regents in the event there is ever  
39 an insufficient amount of money in the bond retirement account to pay

1 any installment of interest or principal and interest coming due on the  
2 bonds or any of them;

3 (d) A covenant fixing conditions under which bonds on a parity with  
4 any bonds outstanding may be issued.

5 The proceeds of the sale of all bonds shall be deposited in the  
6 state treasury to the credit of the Washington State University  
7 building account and shall be used solely for paying the costs of the  
8 projects. The Washington State University building account shall be  
9 credited with the investment income derived pursuant to RCW 43.84.080  
10 on the investible balances of scientific permanent fund and  
11 agricultural permanent fund, less the allocation to the state  
12 treasurer's service ((~~account~~ ~~[fund]~~)) fund pursuant to RCW 43.08.190.

16 **Sec. 303.** RCW 28B.50.360 and 2000 c 65 s 1 are each amended to

18 Within thirty-five days from the date of start of each quarter all  
19 collected building fees of each such community and technical college  
20 shall be paid into the state treasury, and shall be credited as  
21 follows:

22 (1) On or before June 30th of each year the college board if  
23 issuing bonds payable out of building fees shall certify to the state  
24 treasurer the amounts required in the ensuing twelve-month period to  
25 pay and secure the payment of the principal of and interest on such  
26 bonds. The state treasurer shall thereupon deposit the amounts so

17 NEW SECTION. Sec. 304. In order to coordinate 2003-2005 capital  
18 budget requests with the joint legislative audit and review committee's  
19 study of higher education facility preservation, each higher education  
20 baccalaureate institution and the state board for community and  
21 technical colleges shall report the following information to the joint  
22 legislative audit and review committee, the office of financial  
23 management, and the higher education coordinating board by the  
24 following dates:

25 (1) By May 1, 2002, a list of all facility renovation and  
26 replacement projects for which the baccalaureate institution or state  
27 board for community and technical colleges anticipates requesting over  
28 five million dollars will be requested in the first six years of the  
29 2003-2013 ten year capital plan; and

30 (2) By July 1, 2002, planning, justification, and budget  
31 information for each listed project, including completed predesigns for  
32 2003-2005 projects.

33 NEW SECTION. Sec. 305. (1) The public works board shall provide  
34 a follow-up to its 1998 infrastructure needs assessment by reevaluating  
35 existing infrastructure financing sources available for local  
36 government infrastructure needs, as currently authorized by the state.

1 (2) The evaluation shall include a listing, description, and the  
2 extent of utilization of all state authorized financing options. The  
3 evaluation shall also determine how these sources could be used more  
4 effectively, and recommend legislation necessary to make the sources  
5 more usable.

6 (3) The public works board shall work in cooperation with the  
7 legislative evaluation and accountability program, the municipal  
8 research council, and house of representatives and senate fiscal  
9 committees, as deemed appropriate. The public works board may also  
10 utilize state agencies, community officials, private business  
11 organizations, labor organizations, and other entities as appropriate  
12 in conducting the evaluation.

13 (4) The public works board shall report its findings to the house

16 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 306.** (1) A joint select committee on capitol  
17 historic district governance is established. The joint select  
18 committee, in consultation with the state capitol committee and the  
19 department of general administration, shall conduct a study to assess,  
20 at a minimum, the feasibility of: (a) Creating a separate entity to  
21 oversee the future maintenance and preservation needs of the state  
22 legislative building, the John A. Cherberg building, the John L.  
23 O'Brien building, the Newhouse building, and the Pritchard building;  
24 (b) an organizational structure for this entity; and (c) a  
25 recommendation of funding needed for the creation and on-going  
26 operation of this entity with consideration given to the necessary and  
27 unique preservation requirements for continued maintenance of these

29 (2) The joint select committee consists of two members selected by

35 (3) The committee shall report its findings and recommendations to

1        NEW SECTION.    **Sec. 307.**    If any provision of this act or its  
2 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the  
3 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other  
4 persons or circumstances is not affected.

5        NEW SECTION.    **Sec. 308.**    This act is necessary for the immediate  
6 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the  
7 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect  
8 immediately.

1        Note: Governor's explanation of partial veto is as follows:

2        "I am returning herewith, without my approval as to sections 104  
3 and 126(3), Engrossed Senate Bill No. 6396 entitled:

4        "AN ACT Relating to the capital budget;"

5        **Section 104, page 4, Department of Community, Trade, and Economic**  
6 **Development**

7 This section would have modified the appropriation from a governance  
8 study, yet to be completed, of the Burke Museum into a study to expand  
9 the museum. The governance study is important because it will identify  
10 alternative funding for a museum expansion. The amended language also  
11 authorized expenditures for preservation of museum collections (an  
12 operational expense). These funds were first appropriated for the  
13 Burke Museum in the 1999-2001 biennium, at which time I vetoed  
14 provisional language for a study of future expansion of the museum. It  
15 is inappropriate to forego the governance study and to fund  
16 preservation of collections with capital funds.

17        **Section 126(3), page 18, Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation**

18 This section would have provided a direct appropriation to People for  
19 Salmon (PFS) from Salmon Recovery Funding Board (SRFB) grant funds.  
20 The SRFB was designed to be an independent decision maker for the  
21 allocation of salmon recovery grants. A direct appropriation by the  
22 legislature intrudes upon SRFB autonomy and decision making as to which  
23 projects best aid in fish recovery and are most desirable to fund. A  
24 similar provision was vetoed last year for the same reasons.  
25 I add this special note regarding section 110, which I have allowed to  
26 stand. This section revises and increases funding for the Bremerton  
27 Readiness Center for the Military Department. These funds will  
28 construct additional classrooms to support an emergency services  
29 training center. While there are unique programmatic, geographic and  
30 interagency aspects of this project, proceeding with this project  
31 should in no way suggest concurrence or agreement with any future,  
32 state-financed emergency services training facilities.

33        For these reasons, I have vetoed sections 104 and 126(3) of  
34 Engrossed Senate Bill No. 6396.



1           With the exception of sections 104 and 126(3), Engrossed Senate  
2 Bill No. 6396 is approved."
