- 1 AN ACT Relating to professional vocational/career evaluation and
- 2 rehabilitation counselors; and amending RCW 18.225.010, 18.225.020,
- 3 18.225.030, 18.225.060, 18.225.070, and 18.225.090.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 18.225.010 and 2001 c 251 s 1 are each amended to read 6 as follows:
- 7 Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions in 8 this section apply throughout this chapter.
- 9 (1) "Advanced social work" means the application of social work
  10 theory and methods including emotional and biopsychosocial assessment,
  11 psychotherapy under the supervision of a licensed independent clinical
  12 social worker, case management, consultation, advocacy, counseling, and
  13 community organization.
- 14 (2) "Applicant" means a person who completes the required 15 application, pays the required fee, is at least eighteen years of age, 16 and meets any background check requirements and uniform disciplinary 17 act requirements.
- 18 (3) "Committee" means the Washington state mental health

- counselors, marriage and family therapists, ((and)) social workers, and professional vocational/career evaluation and rehabilitation counselors advisory committee.
  - (4) "Department" means the department of health.

- (5) "Disciplining authority" means the department.
- (6) "Independent clinical social work" means the diagnosis and treatment of emotional and mental disorders based on knowledge of human development, the causation and treatment of psychopathology, psychotherapeutic treatment practices, and social work practice as defined in advanced social work. Treatment modalities include but are not limited to diagnosis and treatment of individuals, couples, families, groups, or organizations.
- (7) "Marriage and family therapy" means the diagnosis and treatment of mental and emotional disorders, whether cognitive, affective, or behavioral, within the context of relationships, including marriage and family systems. Marriage and family therapy involves the professional application of psychotherapeutic and family systems theories and techniques in the delivery of services to individuals, couples, and families for the purpose of treating such diagnosed nervous and mental disorders. The practice of marriage and family therapy means the rendering of professional marriage and family therapy services to individuals, couples, and families, singly or in groups, whether such services are offered directly to the general public or through organizations, either public or private, for a fee, monetary or otherwise.
- (8) "Mental health counseling" means the application of principles of human development, learning theory, psychotherapy, group dynamics, and etiology of mental illness and dysfunctional behavior to individuals, couples, families, groups, and organizations, for the purpose of treatment of mental disorders and promoting optimal mental health and functionality. Mental health counseling also includes, but is not limited to, the assessment, diagnosis, and treatment of mental and emotional disorders, as well as the application of a wellness model of mental health.
- (9) "Professional vocational/career evaluation and rehabilitation counselor" means the application of a systematic process which assists persons with physical, mental, developmental, cognitive, and emotional disabilities to achieve their personal, career, and independent living

goals in the most integrated setting possible through the application 1 of the counseling process. The counseling process involves 2 communication, goal setting, and beneficial growth or change through 3 self-advocacy, psychological, vocational, social, and behavioral 4 interventions. The specific techniques and modalities utilized within 5 rehabilitation counseling process and career counseling may include, 6 but are not limited to assessment and appraisal of individuals, 7 including selecting, administering, scoring and interpreting individual 8 and group aptitude, ability, achievement, interest, and personality 9 tests; diagnosis and treatment planning for mental, emotional, and 10 behavioral conditions and psycho-social adjustment; vocational/career 11 12 counseling; case management; program evaluation; and job analysis, job 13 development placement services, labor market surveys, and interventions 14 to remove barriers and make accommodations in employment, environmental and attitudinal areas. 15

- 16 <u>(10)</u> "Secretary" means the secretary of health or the secretary's designee.
- (11) "Vocational/career evaluation" means the practice of 18 evaluation that includes coordinating medical and physical limits, work 19 history, education, and transferable knowledge, skills and abilities 20 21 into the determination of employability and suitability of a person for any occupation, and training analysis. It involves the application of 22 personal interviews; work sample assessments; physical functional 23 capacity measurement; psychological testing and measurement by 24 individual or group assessment for ability and attitudes, achievement, 25 26 vocational interests, personality, and behavioral adjustment; job 27 analysis, job classification and pay, job placement, and job/labor market surveys. 28
- 29 **Sec. 2.** RCW 18.225.020 and 2001 c 251 s 2 are each amended to read 30 as follows:

A person must not represent himself or herself as a licensed advanced social worker, licensed independent clinical social worker, licensed mental health counselor, ((or)) licensed marriage and family therapist, or licensed professional vocational/career evaluator and rehabilitation counselor, without being licensed by the department.

Sec. 3. RCW 18.225.030 and 2001 c 251 s 3 are each amended to read as follows:

Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to prohibit or restrict:

- (1) The practice of marriage and family therapy, mental health counseling, ((or)) social work, or professional vocational/career evaluation and rehabilitation counseling by an individual otherwise regulated under this title and performing services within the authorized scope of practice;
- (2) The practice of marriage and family therapy, mental health counseling, ((ex)) social work, or professional vocational/career evaluation and rehabilitation counseling by an individual employed by the government of the United States or state of Washington while engaged in the performance of duties prescribed by the laws of the United States or state of Washington;
- (3) The practice of marriage and family therapy, mental health counseling, ((or)) social work, or professional vocational/career evaluation and rehabilitation counseling by a person who is a regular student in an educational program based on recognized national standards and approved by the secretary, and whose performance of services is pursuant to a regular course of instruction or assignments from an instructor and under the general supervision of the instructor;
- (4) The practice of marriage and family therapy, mental health counseling, ((or)) social work, or professional vocational/career evaluation and rehabilitation counseling under the auspices of a religious denomination, church, or religious organization.
- **Sec. 4.** RCW 18.225.060 and 2001 c 251 s 6 are each amended to read 27 as follows:

The Washington state mental health counselors, marriage and family therapists, ((and)) social workers, and professional vocational/career evaluation and rehabilitation counselors advisory committee is established.

(1) The committee shall be ((comprised)) composed of ((nine)) eleven members. Two members shall be licensed mental health counselors. Two members shall be licensed marriage and family therapists. Two members shall be licensed professional vocational/career evaluation and rehabilitation counselors. One member shall be a licensed independent clinical social worker, and one member

shall be a licensed advanced social worker. Three members must be consumers and represent the public at large and may not be licensed mental health care providers.

- (2) Three members shall be appointed for a term of one year, three members shall be appointed for a term of two years, and three members shall be appointed for a term of three years. One professional vocational/career evaluation and rehabilitation counselor shall be appointed for an initial term of two years and one for three years. Subsequent members shall be appointed for terms of three years. A person must not serve as a member for more than two consecutive terms.
  - (3)(a) Each member must be a resident of the state of Washington.
- (b) Each member must not hold an office in a professional association for mental health, social work, ((or)) marriage and family therapy, or professional vocational/career evaluation and rehabilitation counselors and must not be employed by the state of Washington.
- (c) Each professional member must have been actively engaged as a mental health counselor, marriage and family therapist,  $((\frac{or}{e}))$  social worker, or professional vocational/career evaluation and rehabilitation counselors for five years immediately preceding appointment.
- (d) The consumer members must represent the general public and be unaffiliated directly or indirectly with the professions licensed under this chapter.
  - (4) The secretary shall appoint the committee members.
  - (5) Committee members are immune from suit in an action, civil or criminal, based on the department's disciplinary proceedings or other official acts performed in good faith.
  - (6) Committee members shall be compensated in accordance with RCW 43.03.240, including travel expenses in carrying out his or her authorized duties in accordance with RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060.
    - (7) The committee shall elect a chair and vice-chair.
- **Sec. 5.** RCW 18.225.070 and 2001 c 251 s 7 are each amended to read 33 as follows:
- The department of health may seek the advice and assistance of the advisory committee in administering this chapter, including, but not limited to:

- 1 (1) Advice and recommendations regarding the establishment or implementation of rules related to the administration of this chapter;
  - (2) Advice, recommendations, and consultation regarding case disposition guidelines and priorities related to unprofessional conduct cases regarding licensed mental health counselors, licensed clinical social workers, licensed advanced social workers, ((and)) licensed marriage and family therapists, and professional vocational/career evaluation and rehabilitation counselors;
  - (3) Assistance and consultation of individual committee members as needed in the review, analysis, and disposition of reports of unprofessional conduct and consumer complaints;
- 12 (4) Assistance and recommendations to enhance consumer education; 13 and
- 14 (5) Assistance and recommendations regarding any continuing 15 education and continuing competency programs administered under the 16 provisions of ((the [this])) this chapter.
- **Sec. 6.** RCW 18.225.090 and 2003 c 108 s 1 are each amended to read 18 as follows:
  - (1) The secretary shall issue a license to any applicant who demonstrates to the satisfaction of the secretary that the applicant meets the following education and experience requirements for the applicant's practice area.
    - (a) Licensed social work classifications:
    - (i) Licensed advanced social worker:

- (A) Graduation from a master's or doctorate social work educational program accredited by the council on social work education and approved by the secretary based upon nationally recognized standards;
  - (B) Successful completion of an approved examination;
- (C) Successful completion of a supervised experience requirement. The experience requirement consists of a minimum of three thousand two hundred hours with ninety hours of supervision by a licensed independent clinical social worker or a licensed advanced social worker who has been licensed or certified for at least two years. Of those hours, fifty hours must include direct supervision by a licensed advanced social worker or licensed independent clinical social worker; the other forty hours may be with an equally qualified licensed mental health practitioner. Forty hours must be in one-to-one supervision and

- fifty hours may be in one-to-one supervision or group supervision. 1 Distance supervision is limited to forty supervision hours. hundred hours must be in direct client contact; and 3
  - (D) Successful completion of continuing education requirements of thirty-six hours, with six in professional ethics.
    - (ii) Licensed independent clinical social worker:

- (A) Graduation from a master's or doctorate level social work educational program accredited by the council on social work education and approved by the secretary based upon nationally recognized standards;
  - (B) Successful completion of an approved examination;
- (C) Successful completion of a supervised experience requirement. The experience requirement consists of a minimum of four thousand hours of experience, of which one thousand hours must be direct client contact, over a three-year period supervised by a licensed independent clinical social worker who has been licensed or certified for at least five years and who has had at least one year of experience in supervising the clinical social work practice of others, with supervision of at least one hundred thirty hours by a licensed mental health practitioner. Of the total supervision, seventy hours must be with an independent clinical social worker meeting the qualifications under this subsection (1)(a)(ii)(C); the other sixty hours may be with an equally qualified licensed mental health practitioner. Sixty hours must be in one-to-one supervision and seventy hours may be in one-toone supervision or group supervision. Distance supervision is limited to sixty supervision hours; and
- (D) Successful completion of continuing education requirements of thirty-six hours, with six in professional ethics.
  - (b) Licensed mental health counselor:
- (i) Graduation from a master's or doctoral level educational program in mental health counseling or a related discipline from a college or university approved by the secretary based upon nationally recognized standards;
  - (ii) Successful completion of an approved examination;
- 35 (iii) Successful completion of a supervised experience requirement. The experience requirement consists of a minimum of thirty-six months 36 37 full-time counseling or three thousand hours of postgraduate mental 38 health counseling under the supervision of a qualified licensed mental

- health counselor in an approved setting. The three thousand hours of required experience includes a minimum of one hundred hours spent in immediate supervision with the qualified licensed mental health counselor, and includes a minimum of one thousand two hundred hours of direct counseling with individuals, couples, families, or groups; and
  - (iv) Successful completion of continuing education requirements of thirty-six hours, with six in professional ethics.
    - (c) Licensed marriage and family therapist:

- (i) Graduation from a master's degree or doctoral degree educational program in marriage and family therapy or graduation from an educational program in an allied field equivalent to a master's degree or doctoral degree in marriage and family therapy approved by the secretary based upon nationally recognized standards;
  - (ii) Successful passage of an approved examination;
- (iii) Successful completion of a supervised experience requirement. The experience requirement consists of a minimum of two calendar years of full-time marriage and family therapy. Of the total supervision, one hundred hours must be with a licensed marriage and family therapist with at least five years' clinical experience; the other one hundred hours may be with an equally qualified licensed mental health practitioner. Total experience requirements include:
- (A) A minimum of three thousand hours of experience, one thousand hours of which must be direct client contact; at least five hundred hours must be gained in diagnosing and treating couples and families; plus
- (B) At least two hundred hours of qualified supervision with a supervisor. At least one hundred of the two hundred hours must be one-on-one supervision, and the remaining hours may be in one-on-one or group supervision.
- Applicants who have completed a master's program accredited by the commission on accreditation for marriage and family therapy education of the American association for marriage and family therapy may be credited with five hundred hours of direct client contact and one hundred hours of formal meetings with an approved supervisor; and
- 35 (iv) Successful completion of continuing education requirements of 36 thirty-six hours, with six in professional ethics.

(i) Current certification within two years of the effective date of this act, as a certified rehabilitation counselor; an American board of vocational experts, diplomate or fellow; a certified disability management specialist; or is a nationally certified career counselor from the specialty board of the national board of certified counselors; or

- (ii) Within two years of the effective date of this act, graduation from a bachelor's degree educational program acceptable to the board, and employment as a vocational rehabilitation counselor for the state, either as a contractor or an employee, for five years full time, or its prorated part-time equivalent, and successful completion of an examination acceptable to the board; or
- (iii) Graduation from a master's degree or doctoral degree educational program in rehabilitation counseling, educational psychology, counseling, or psychology, or graduation from an educational program in an allied field equivalent to a master's degree or doctoral degree approved by the secretary based upon nationally recognized standards;
- (iv) Successful completion of an approved examination such as the certified rehabilitation counselor exam or the American board of vocational experts exam, or equivalent exam at a score level acceptable to the board; and
- (v) Successful completion of a minimum of three years of full-time work experience, or its prorated part-time equivalent, in rehabilitation counseling or vocational/career evaluation work and one additional year of full-time work experience supervised by a certified rehabilitation counselor, an American board of vocational experts diplomate or fellow, or a person licensed under this professional license.
- 30 (2) The department shall establish by rule what constitutes 31 adequate proof of meeting the criteria.
- 32 (3) In addition, applicants shall be subject to the grounds for 33 denial of a license or issuance of a conditional license under chapter 34 18.130 RCW.
