House Bills

HB 1096 by Representatives Berkey, Pearson, Morris, Kristiansen, Sullivan, Buck, Dunshee, Cooper, Lovick, Sehlin, Bailey, Kessler and Nixon

Revising business and occupation taxation for certain aviation businesses.

Provides that, upon every person engaging within this state in the business of making sales at retail that are exempt from the tax imposed under chapter 82.08 RCW by reason of RCW 82.08.0261, 82.08.0262, or 82.08.0263, that are classified by the federal aviation administration as FAR part 145 certificated repair stations with an airframe class 4 rating and limited capabilities in instruments, radio equipment, and specialized services, as to such persons, the amount of tax with respect to such business shall be equal to the gross proceeds of sales of the business, multiplied by the rate of .275 percent.

HB 1097 by Representatives Linville and Hinkle

Directing the department of ecology to conduct pilot rule making to establish and assign trust authorization credits.

Finds that the trust water program can be used to achieve a variety of water resource management objectives throughout the state, including responding to drought, improving streamflows on a voluntary basis, providing water mitigation, or reserving water supply for future uses.

Finds that the trust program can be used to facilitate the reallocation of water from one beneficial use to another.

Declares an intent to authorize the department to conduct pilot rule making to test the proposition that water banking can facilitate the reallocation of water and reduce water transfer transaction costs.

Revising rules for siting of secure community transition facilities.

Repeals RCW 71.09.342.

HB 1104 by Representatives O'Brien, Kagi, Miloscia, Cox, Veloria, Hankins, Kirby, Kessler, Berkey, Dickerson, Mielke, Kenney and Upthegrove

Creating a risk management unit within the department of corrections.

Provides that the risk management unit shall: (1)

Identify liability and property risk that may have a significant economic impact on the department;

(2) Evaluate existing loss control programs within the department as appropriate to suggest improvements and recognize successful safety policies and procedures;

(3) Identify new methods to eliminate or improve conditions and practices that contribute to loss whenever practical;

(4) Identify methods to assist the department to meet the requirements for insurance coverage or service; and

(5) Maintain loss history information for the purpose of identifying and analyzing risk exposures.

Providing for identification of public assistance recipients with outstanding warrants.

Provides that, on a quarterly basis, the department shall coordinate with the state patrol to determine if any recipients of public assistance have outstanding warrants from any court of competent jurisdiction for a felony or misdemeanor. The department shall immediately provide the name and address of any person found to have an outstanding warrant for his or her arrest to the state patrol. The department shall suspend payments pursuant to RCW 74.08.290 for any period a recipient is imprisoned.

Senate Bills

SB 5154 by Senators Mulliken, Oke and T. Sheldon

Creating a procedure for landlords to immediately evict tenants involved in criminal activity.

Declares an intent to protect property owners, agents, and neighbors from further mental anguish, threats, physical harm, and financial loss by providing for the immediate eviction of persons participating in criminal actions or unlawful civil disruptions.

SB 5155 by Senators Mulliken and T. Sheldon

Prohibiting strikes by educational employees.

Declares it is unlawful for an employee or an employee organization, directly or indirectly, to induce, instigate, encourage, authorize, ratify, or participate in a strike.

Declares it is unlawful for an employer to authorize, consent to, or condone a strike, to conduct a lockout, to pay or agree to pay an employee for any day in which the

employee participates in a strike, or to pay or agree to pay any increase in compensation or benefits to an employee in response to or as a result of a strike or any act that violates this act.

Provides that, if a violation of this act occurs, or is imminently threatened, any citizen domiciled within the jurisdictional boundaries of the state may petition the superior court of the county in which the school district, or any part thereof, is situated for an injunction restraining the violation or imminently threatened violation.

SB 5157 by Senators Morton, Rasmussen, Hewitt, Mulliken and Swecker

Changing qualifications for appointment to the veterinary board of governors.

Requires that at least two licensed members shall be from eastern Washington. At least one licensed member shall be in active practice with a substantial focus on large animal veterinary medicine.

Expanding the definition of resident student for purposes of higher education.

Includes any person who has completed the full senior year of high school and obtained a high school diploma, both at a Washington public high school or private high school approved under chapter 28A.195 RCW, or a person who has received the equivalent of a diploma; who has lived in Washington for at least three years; who is initially admitted to an institution of higher education within one year of receiving the diploma or its equivalent; and who provides to the institution an affidavit indicating a willingness to file an application to become a permanent resident at the earliest opportunity the individual is eligible to do so.

SB 5159 by Senators Haugen, Horn, Esser and Schmidt

Creating H.O.G. motorcycle plates.

Declares that "H.O.G." motorcycle license plate means a license plate that displays a symbol of the sponsor of the

Harley Owner's Group.

Directs the department to create, design, and issue a special H.O.G. license plate that may be used in lieu of regular or personalized license plates for motorcycles, upon terms and conditions established by the department. The special license plates will commemorate the Harley Owner's Group and their goal of increasing the number of riders of all skill levels who are able to attend motorcycle safety education programs in Washington.

Authorizing certain counties to withdraw from the growth management act.

Declares an intent to permit a county that is east of the Cascade crest and north of Interstate 90, with a population of less than ten thousand and a taxable land base of fifteen percent or less, to withdraw from the state growth management act and all the requirements thereof.

SB 5161 by Senators Hewitt, Rasmussen, Honeyford, T. Sheldon, Hale, Hargrove, Horn, Haugen, Mulliken, Oke, Sheahan, Roach, McCaslin, Benton, Brandland, Deccio, Esser, Johnson, Parlette, Rossi and Schmidt

Repealing ergonomics rules.

Provides that rules dealing with musculoskeletal disorders, filed on May 26, 2000, by the director, and codified as WAC 296-62-05101 through 296-62-05176, are repealed. The director shall not adopt any new or amended rules dealing with musculoskeletal disorders that are substantially the same as these rules until and unless required by congress or the federal occupational safety and health administration.

SB 5163 by Senators Doumit, Swecker, Hargrove, Reardon, Regala, Jacobsen and Franklin

Creating the license suspension review committee.

Finds that existing law as it relates to the suspension of commercial fishing licenses does not take into account the real-life circumstances faced by the state's commercial fishing fleets. The nature of the commercial fishing industry, together with the complexity of fisheries regulations, is such that honest mistakes can be made by well-meaning and otherwise law-abiding fishers. Commercial fishing violations that occur within an acceptable margin of error should not result in the suspension of fishing privileges. Likewise, fishers facing the possibility of license suspension or revocation deserve the opportunity to explain any extenuating circumstances prior to having his or her professional privileges suspended.

Declares an intent, by creating the license suspension review committee, to provide a fisher with the opportunity to explain any extenuating circumstances that led to a commercial fishing violation.

Finds that gross abuses of fish stocks should not be tolerated. Individuals convicted of even one violation that is egregious in nature, causing serious detriment to a fishery or the competitive disposition of other fishers, should have his or her license suspended and revoked.

SB 5164 by Senators T. Sheldon, Swecker, Fraser, Fairley, Oke, Haugen and Rasmussen

Modifying oyster harvest requirements for certain persons of disability.

Provides that a person of disability, age sixty-five or older, may take the daily limit of oysters off the beach without shucking the oysters.

SB 5165 by Senators Kohl-Welles, Kline, McCaslin and Franklin

Regulating vehicular pursuit.

Requires that, by December 1, 2003, the Washington state criminal justice training commission, the Washington state patrol, the Washington association of sheriffs and police chiefs, and organizations representing state and local law enforcement officers shall develop a written model policy on vehicular pursuits.

Requires that, by June 1, 2004, every state, county, and municipal law enforcement agency shall adopt and implement a written vehicular pursuit policy. The policy adopted may, but need not, be the model policy developed under this act. However, any policy adopted must address the minimum requirements specified.

Requires that, by June 30, 2006, every full-time law enforcement officer employed by a state, county, or municipal law enforcement agency shall have been trained on vehicular pursuits. Every new full-time law enforcement officer employed by a state, county, or municipal law enforcement agency after June 30, 2006, also shall be trained, within six months of employment, on vehicular pursuits.

Allowing police cars to use HOV lanes.

Declares that, for the purposes of this act, "law enforcement vehicle" means an official marked vehicle, equipped with emergency lights and siren, issued by a state, local, or county law enforcement agency and operated by on-duty state patrol, local, or county law enforcement personnel.
