HB 1012-S by House Committee on Judiciary (originally sponsored by Representatives Bush, Veloria, Miloscia, Kirby, Kenney, Dunshee and Conway)

Regarding residential landlord-tenant relationships.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Provides that, when a tenant, after the exercise of due diligence, is unable to ascertain the physical location of a landlord by the statement of the landlord's address in the rental agreement, by the notice conspicuously posted on the premises, or as notified by certified mail, and service of a legal document is deemed necessary, the tenant may provide service upon the landlord by using both certified mail and regular mail either to the address listed on the property owner's current tax statement for the property being rented by the tenant, to the address provided to the tenant for payment of rent, or to the address provided to the tenant for service of notice or process, and a court having jurisdiction over the matter under RCW 59.18.050 shall deem such service to be adequate notice of the action.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Clarifies 2001 statutory changes made to forest tax statutes.
Repeals RCW 84.33.120.

HB 1157-S by House Committee on State Government (originally sponsored by Representatives Hunt, Armstrong, Shabro, McDermott, Tom, Haigh, Clements, Cairnes, Simpson, Kenney, Schual-Berke and Upthegrove; by request of Secretary of State)

Regulating actions on the validity of ballot measures.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Establishes provisions regulating actions on the validity of ballot measures.

HB 1295-S by House Committee on Health Care (originally sponsored by Representatives Morrell, Bailey, Cody, Kenney and Campbell; by request of Department of Health)

Eliminating barriers to initial licensure in health professions.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Finds that the health care work force shortage is contributing to the health care crisis.

Finds that some unnecessary barriers exist that slow or prevent qualified applicants from becoming credentialed health care providers.

Declares that eliminating these initial barriers to licensure will contribute to state initiatives directed toward easing the health care personnel shortage in Washington.

Provides that a licensed practical nurse with an active license who is in the process of completing or has completed the coursework of a nontraditional registered nurse program approved by the commission can obtain the required clinical experience when: (1) The experience is obtained under the immediate supervision of a registered nurse who agrees to act as the preceptor with the understanding that the licensed practical nurse is practicing under the preceptor's registered nurse license. The preceptor must have an unrestricted license with at least two years of clinical practice in the same type of practice setting where the preceptorship will occur; and

(2) The experience is obtained within six months of completion of the approved nontraditional program.

HB 1696 by Representatives Simpson, Delvin and Lovick; by request of Lieutenant Governor

Revising provisions involving alcohol-related offenses.

HB 1697 by Representatives Schual-Berke, Nixon, Priest, Miloscia, Roach, Voloria, Hudgins, Pflug, McDermott, Upthegrove, Cody and Edwards

Modifying property tax limitations for port districts.

Provides that the limitation under RCW 84.55.010 for a port district with an assessed value of over one hundred billion dollars for taxes levied for collection in calendar year 2004 and thereafter shall be determined without reference to taxes levied for collection in calendar year 2003.

HB 1698 by Representatives Cooper, Anderson, Wood, Jarrett, O'Brien, Murray, Upthegrove, Pflug and Dunshee

Concerning the distribution and use of funds provided to off-road vehicle and nonhighway road recreational activities.

Provides that, beginning January 1, 2013, and updated every ten years thereafter, the interagency committee for outdoor recreation shall contract with an independent entity to study the source and make recommendations on the distribution and use of funds provided to off-road vehicle and nonhighway road recreational activities under this act. The study must determine the relative portion of the motor vehicle fuel tax revenues that are attributable to vehicles operating off-road or on nonhighway roads for recreational purposes as provided in this act. The study must include the types of vehicles and location of their use, the types of recreational activities, the types of recreational facilities used, and the recreational use of forest roads relative to other, nonrecreational uses.

HB 1699 by Representatives Pflug and Anderson

Equalizing salary allocations for teachers.

Provides that, beginning September 1, 2005, and thereafter, the salary allocation for certificated instructional staff shall be determined using the same salary allocation schedule and derived base salary for all districts.

HB 1700 by Representatives Anderson, Pflug and Jarrett

Requiring a statewide cost-of-living index for basic education salary allocations.

Finds that large and growing disparities in the cost-of-living among regions of the state have resulted in widely disparate purchasing power of salaries for certificated instructional staff supported by basic education allocations.

Declares that in the interest of recruiting and retaining qualified instructional staff in all regions of the state, and of ensuring continuous compliance with Article IX, section 2 of the state Constitution, that basic education salary allocations should be adjusted on an ongoing basis for differences in the cost-of-living among regions of the state,

as determined through a rigorous method of economic analysis.

HB 1701 by Representative Dunshee

Revising the limitation on impact fees regarding law enforcement, courts, and jails.

Provides that, for the purposes of RCW 82.02.090(7), "criminal justice facilities" means personnel and the construction and expansion of jails, court facilities, juvenile justice facilities, and police facilities.

HB 1702 by Representatives Hatfield, Mielke, Romero, Armstrong, Cooper, Blake, Boldt, Orcutt, Santos, McCoy, Alexander, Schoesler, Chandler, Grant, Schindler and Condotta

Recovering costs for motorist information signs.

Provides that the department shall charge reasonable fees for the display of individual business signs to defray the costs of their installation and maintenance, and shall charge reasonable fees to recover costs for the erection and maintenance of the motorist information sign panels.

Repeals RCW 47.36.325.

HB 1703 by Representatives Anderson, Nixon, Crouse, Pflug, Priest, Tom, Ericksen, Jarrett and Benson

Providing tax incentives to promote the production and distribution of electricity from alternative sources of energy.

Declares an intent to encourage and expand the commercial generation of electrical power from alternative energy sources to meet the long-term energy needs of the state.

Intends that incentives provided by the state encourage free-market principles that foster technological innovation and entrepreneurial investment in alternative energy sources. This intent is best served by encouraging commercially viable, independent generators of alternative energy-based electrical power to provide such power to established utility distribution networks, including investor-owned utilities and public utility districts.

Declares an intent to promote the use of alternative energy sources for the purpose of electrical generation, tax incentives should be provided in RCW 82.08.02567 and 82.12.02567 for the acquisition of certain machinery and equipment to all qualifying sectors of the state economy, including industrial, commercial, and residential.

HB 1704 by Representatives Kirby, Schindler and McDonald

Allowing landlords to receive direct payments of rent for people on public assistance.

Provides that the department shall direct the payment of the installments of public assistance to any reasonable person, social service agency, or corporation, if the person receiving public assistance has failed to pay rent by the due date provided for in the rental agreement two or more times in a twelve-month period, commencing with the date of the first violation, after service of a three-day notice to comply or vacate under the provisions of RCW 59.12.030(3).

Funding tire recycling.

Creates the vehicle tire recycling account within the state treasury. After the deposit of funds into the motor vehicle account as provided for in RCW 70.95.510(3), the remaining funds received under RCW 70.95.510(1) must be deposited in the vehicle tire recycling account and used by the department of ecology for purposes including but not limited to those specified in RCW 70.95.535.

Authorizes the department of revenue to deduct two percent from the funds collected under RCW 70.95.510 for the purpose of administering and collecting the fee from new replacement tire retailers.

Authorizes use of the funds for: (1) Scrap tire demonstration projects including those implemented by state agencies;

(2) Statewide illegal tire pile cleanups, as provided for in RCW 70.95.240(2)(c), and local citizen scrap tire amnesty events;

(3) Statewide tire carrier tracking, reporting, and enforcement of the movement of tires within this state.

Requires local governments that are recipients of the enforcement program grant funding to submit an annual report to the department of ecology for each year the grant funding is expended, detailing the uses of the funds and including information on what enforcement activities were supported with the grant funds.

Changing the focus of the promise scholarship.

Revises the focus of the promise scholarship.

HB 1707 by Representatives Jarrett, Simpson, Shabro, Sullivan, Moeller, Berkey, Schindler, Linville and Anderson

Revising environmental review provisions to improve the development approval process and enhance economic development.

Declares that proposed essential public facilities identified according to RCW 36.70A.200 may not be conditioned on the payment of a fee under this act to mitigate a specific adverse environmental impact, if an impact fee, as defined in RCW 82.02.090, could be imposed according to RCW 82.02.050 through 82.02.090 to mitigate that specific adverse environmental impact.

Provides that, in urban growth areas in which existing density and intensity is lower than the levels called for in the goals and policies of applicable comprehensive plans adopted according to chapter 36.70A RCW, in order to accommodate infill development and thereby realize the goals and policies of the comprehensive plans, the rules shall provide for categorical exemptions for higher levels of density and intensity of new development than the categorical exemption levels provided for all other areas.

Provides that in situations where all adverse environmental impacts will be mitigated below the level of significance as a result of voluntary measures by the proponent and/or regulatory requirements of development regulations adopted under chapter 36.70A RCW or other local, state, or federal laws, a determination of nonsignificance or a mitigated determination of nonsignificance is the proper threshold determination.

Providing property tax exemptions for severely disabled veterans.

Provides property tax exemptions for persons with disabilities related to the performance of military duties.

HB 1709 by Representatives Anderson, Talcott, Pflug and Cox

Authorizing parent-based performance compensation for certificated employees.

Declares that school districts may provide parent-based performance pay to classroom teachers and educational staff associates who meet one or more of the criteria developed by the professional educator standards board under this act. In providing the parent-based performance pay, school districts shall meet the conditions in this act.

Requires adoption of rules to be applied in all facilities and institutions used for juvenile rehabilitation that: (1) State what constitutes custodial assault; and

(2) Require that all custodial assaults on employees be reported to law enforcement.

HB 1712 by Representatives O'Brien, Mielke and Darneille; by request of Department of Community, Trade, and Economic Development

Revising provisions relating to registration of sex offenders and kidnapping offenders.

HB 1713 by Representatives Romero, Haigh, Grant, Hunt, Armstrong, Rockefeller, Fromhold, Conway, Miloscia and Campbell

Increasing public employees' retirement system, plan 1 members' monetary compensation for accrued sick leave.

Provides that, at the time of separation from state service due to retirement or death, an eligible employee who is a member of the public employees' retirement system, plan 1 or the employee's estate may elect to receive remuneration at a rate equal to one day's current monetary compensation of the employee for each two full days of accrued sick leave.

Requires notice of intent to retire to be made by September 1, 2003. The employee's retirement must be effective before January 1, 2004.

HB 1715 by Representatives Cooper, Delvin, Kenney, Hinkle, O'Brien, Chase, Simpson, Conway, Pettigrew, Sullivan, Edwards and Berkey

Extending death benefits to certain surviving spouses under the law enforcement officers' and fire fighters' retirement system.

Provides that, if the surviving spouse has been lawfully married to such member for five years prior to the member's death, the surviving spouse, when at least age fifty-five, is eligible to receive the benefits under this act.

HB 1716 by Representatives Cody, Campbell, Schual-Berke, Moeller, Edwards and Morrell

Modifying certain health insurance loss ratios.

Authorizing separate billing of tenants for water and wastewater services.

Authorizes a landlord to charge a tenant separately for water or wastewater services by allocating the charges separately through a ratio utility billing system that complies with this act.

Provides that a landlord who allocates charges separately for water or wastewater services may allocate the costs to each tenant by using one or more of the following ratio utility billing system methods: (1) Per tenant;

(2) Proportionately by liveable square footage;

(3) Per type of unit;

(4) Per number of water fixtures; or

(5) Any other method that fairly allocates the charges.

HB 1718 by Representatives Carrell, Delvin, Hinkle, Eickmeyer and Upthegrove

Revising provisions relating to treatment of minors.

Recognizes that minors often have multiple needs and it is important to provide uniform and compatible treatment to minors for their mental, emotional, and physical needs. There is a need to provide uniform prevention and treatment services for the needs of minors who are suffering from illness or other destructive patterns of behavior such as alcohol or drug addiction.

Provides that no public or private agency or governmental entity, nor officer of a public or private agency, nor the professional person in charge, his or her professional designee or attending staff of any such agency, nor any public official performing functions necessary to the administration of this act, nor peace officer responsible for detaining a person under this act, nor any designated chemical dependency specialist, nor treatment program, shall be civilly or criminally liable for performing his or her duties under this act with regard to the decision of whether to admit, release, or detain a person for evaluation and

treatment: PROVIDED, That such duties were performed in good faith and without gross negligence.

HB 1720 by Representatives Upthegrove, Delvin and Dickerson

Revising provisions for petitioning for nonparental custody of a child.

Requires a party seeking a custody order to submit, along with his or her motion, an affidavit declaring that the child is not in the physical custody of one of its parents or that neither parent is a suitable custodian and setting forth facts supporting the requested order. The party seeking custody shall give notice, along with a copy of the affidavit, to other parties to the proceedings, who may file opposing affidavits.

HB 1722 by Representatives Gombosky and Cairnes

Limiting the taxability of certain internet transactions.

Revises provisions relating to the taxability of persons with limited connections to Washington.

HB 1723 by Representatives Carrell, Gombosky, Talcott, Cairnes and Roach

Exempting qualified historic property from the state property tax.

Declares that a "qualified historic property" means historic property that: (1) Is listed on the Washington heritage register, the national register of historic places, or a local register of historic places created by comprehensive

ordinance certified by the secretary of interior as provided in P.L. 96-515;

(2) Is residential property occupied by the owner; and

(3) Has incurred expenditures for maintenance and repair activity that exceed ten percent of the assessed value of the residential structure.

Declares an intent to further the development of natural science, wildlife, and environmental education by establishing a competitive grant program, funded through state moneys to the extent those moneys are appropriated, or made available through other sources, for proven natural science, wildlife, and environmental education programs that are fully aligned with the state's essential academic learning requirements.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Provides that subagents appointed by the director under RCW 46.01.140 have the same authority to mail out registrations and replacement plates to Internet payment option customers as the agents until directed otherwise by legislative authority.

Requires the department to provide notice to Internet payment option customers that there is a three dollar and fifty cent fee for selecting a subagent to mail out registrations and replacement plates.

Takes effect October 1, 2003.

Authorizes a hygienist to place antimicrobials pursuant to the order of a licensed dentist and under the dentist's required supervision.

SB 5649 by Senators Swecker, Rasmussen and Kohl-Welles; by request of Department of Health

Authorizes the state board of health to reference the United States food and drug administration's food code for the purpose of adopting food service rules.

Tightening requirements for adoption-related advertising.

Declares that nothing in RCW 26.33.400 applies to any radio or television station or any publisher, printer, or distributor of any newspaper, magazine, billboard, or other advertising medium which accepts advertising and attempts to verify compliance with RCW 26.33.400 in good faith without knowledge of its violation of any provision of RCW 26.33.400.

SB 5653 by Senators Sheahan and Brown

Expanding "residency" for purposes of attending Washington public schools.

Provides that any child who is of school age and otherwise eligible, residing in a home that is located in Idaho but that has a Washington address for the purposes of the United States postal service, shall be admitted, without payment of tuition, to the nearest Washington school district and shall be considered a resident student for state apportionment and all other purposes.

Authorizing multiple fire districts to annex portions of a newly incorporated city or town.

Authorizes the limited use of new methods to locate utility rights of way on state lands and forest lands.

SB 5657 by Senators Roach, Fraser, Winsley, Eide, Benton, Rasmussen and Shin

Increasing public employees' retirement system, plan 1 members' monetary compensation for accrued sick leave.

Provides that, at the time of separation from state service due to retirement or death, an eligible employee who is a member of the public employees' retirement system, plan 1 or the employee's estate may elect to receive remuneration at a rate equal to one day's current monetary compensation of the employee for each two full days of accrued sick leave.

Requires notice of intent to retire to be made by September 1, 2003. The employee's retirement must be effective before January 1, 2004.

SB 5658 by Senators Mulliken, Haugen, T. Sheldon, Morton and Rasmussen

Concerning use of the best available science under the growth management act.

Provides that, where a proposed critical area ordinance is based upon science that has yet to be replicated in a physical context similar to the one at issue, but is theoretically sound and otherwise meets the test for best available science, the science shall be deemed to constitute best available science.

Declares that the requirement to consider the best available science under this act does not obligate a county or city to use science from a different physical context if the county or city determines that such science is not applicable to a specific local situation or physical context, even if it is the only available science.

Declares that the requirement to consider the best available science is a procedural, not substantive, requirement.

Creates the educational assistance grant program for students with dependents subject to the availability of receipts of gifts, grants, or endowments from private

sources. The program is created to serve financially needy students with dependents eighteen years of age or younger, by assisting them directly through a grant program to pursue a degree or certificate at public or private institutions of higher education, as defined in RCW 28B.10.802, that participate in the state need grant program.

Provides that the educational assistance grant program for students with dependents grants may be used by eligible participants to attend any public or private college or university in the state of Washington as defined in RCW 28B.10.802. The participant is not eligible for a grant if the grant will be used to pursue a degree in theology.

Declares that nothing in chapter 36.70A RCW may be construed as preventing a county or city from allowing agricultural lands that are not currently being used in commercial production from being used for recreational activities, including, but not limited to, playing fields for sports played on grass, provided that no permanent structures are erected on the agricultural land.

SB 5662 by Senators Hale, T. Sheldon and Schmidt

Clarifying community economic revitalization board membership provisions.

Revises community economic revitalization board membership provisions.

Studying the feasibility of state boundary line changes.

Appropriates the sum of twenty-seven thousand dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2004, from the general fund to the department of community, trade, and economic development for the purposes of this act.

Making it a crime to traffic in persons.

Provides that a person is guilty of trafficking in the first degree when: (1) Such person knows that force, fraud, or coercion will be used to cause any person to engage in forced labor or involuntary servitude;

(2) Such person: (a) Recruits, harbors, transports, provides, or obtains by any means another person; or (b) benefits financially or by receiving anything of value from participation in a venture which has engaged in acts set forth in this provision; and

(3) The acts or venture set forth in this provision: (a) Involve committing or attempting to commit kidnapping; (b) involve a finding of sexual motivation under RCW 9.94A.835; or (c) result in a death.

Declares that trafficking in the first degree is a class A felony.

Provides that a person is guilty of trafficking in the second degree when: (1) Such person knows that force, fraud, or coercion will be used to cause any person to engage in forced labor or involuntary servitude; and

(2) Such person: (a) Recruits, harbors, transports, provides, or obtains by any means another person; or (b) benefits financially or by receiving anything of value from participation in a venture which has engaged in acts set forth in this act.

Declares that trafficking in the second degree is a class A felony.

SB 5671 by Senators Keiser, Winsley, Doumit and Kohl-Welles

Regulating mortgage lending practices.

Finds that abusive mortgage lending has become an increasing problem in this state, exacerbating the loss of equity in homes and causing the number of foreclosures to increase in recent years.

Declares that, while the marketplace appears to operate effectively for conventional mortgages, too many homeowners find themselves victims of overreaching lenders who provide loans with unnecessarily high costs and terms that are unnecessary to secure repayment of the loan.

Finds that as competition and self-regulation have not eliminated the abusive terms from home-secured loans, the consumer protection provisions of this act are necessary to encourage lending at reasonable rates with reasonable terms.

Requires a licensee to provide, prior to the closing of a residential mortgage loan, a notice to each borrower of the annual percentage rate of the loan and whether or not the loan has a prepayment penalty.

SB 5674 by Senators Finkbeiner, Prentice, Esser, Haugen and Horn

Modifying regional transit authority provisions.

Provides that, after July 1, 2003, for financing and project purposes, any area annexed shall be included in the most appropriate subarea of the five subareas identified in the authority's system plan adopted in May 1996. When annexed, taxes from an area joining the authority must be used only for projects, facilities, and services within that subarea.

Requires that authority tax revenue must be allocated proportionally to the subareas based on the share of tax revenues each subarea generates. This determination shall be made according to a reasonable method which may require estimates or other approximate methods. The tax revenue allocated to a subarea shall be used to finance costs incurred for projects within the subarea.

Provides that, after July 1, 2003, revenue bonds may be issued only to fund projects within one subarea and shall pledge only revenue derived within the subarea.

Provides that, after July 1, 2003, the proceeds from the issuance of general obligation bonds must be used to finance projects, services, or facilities within one chosen subarea. As part of the bond financing plan, the authority shall indicate how the proceeds from the issuance of general obligation bonds will be apportioned between the five subareas. The authority shall maintain five separate accounts for the deposit of proceeds that are to be used in the five subareas.

Provides that, after July 1st, special assessment or revenue bonds may be issued only to fund projects within

one subarea as identified in an authority's system plan adopted in May 1996 and shall pledge only revenue derived within the subarea.
