On page 26, after line 14 of the amendment, insert:

8 "<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 18. (1) The interagency committee for 9 outdoor recreation, the department of fish and wildlife, the 10 department of natural resources, and counties shall work together 11 to obtain necessary information to complete a report on the fiscal 12 impact of payments in lieu of taxes provided for in this act.

13 (2) The report shall include a financial analysis determining 14 the difference by county, for those counties having less than 15 thirty percent of their total land in private ownership, of assessing property taxes on lands acquired under this chapter by 16 17 state agencies based on one hundred percent of a property's true 18 and fair value compared to assessing property as open space under 19 chapter 84.34 RCW. The analysis shall also compare the fiscal 20 impacts of using these different property tax rates by those 21 counties for existing game lands held by the department of fish and 22 wildlife and natural areas managed by the department of natural 23 resources.

(3) The interagency committee for outdoor recreation shall
provide the report to the appropriate committees of the legislature
by December 1, 2005."

EFFECT: Removes the requirement for state agencies acquiring land with funds from the Riparian Protection Account, and for the Department of Natural Resources acquiring any natural areas or natural resource conservation area lands under the Washington Wildlife and Recreation Program, to pay property taxes at 100 percent of true and fair value in counties having less than 30 percent of land in private ownership. Directs the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation to work with stakeholders to research and report findings to the Legislature comparing the fiscal impacts to counties of using different property tax rates on certain lands acquired under the Washington Wildlife and Recreation Program.
