ESSB 5699 - H COMM AMD

Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the following:

3 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that aquatic invasive freshwater 4 aquatic alqae species and are causing economic, 5 environmental, and public health problems that affect the citizens and 6 aquatic resources of our state. Many highly destructive species, such 7 as the zebra mussel, are currently not found in Washington's waters and 8 efforts should be made to prevent the introduction or spread of these 9 aquatic invasive species into our state waters. Preventing new introductions is significantly less expensive and causes far less 10 11 ecological damage than trying to control new infestations.

12 The legislature also finds that freshwater algae, particularly 13 blue-green algae, are also seriously degrading the water quality and 14 recreational value of a number of our lakes. Blue-green algae can 15 produce toxins that inhibit recreational uses and pose a threat to 16 humans and pets.

17 It is therefore the intent of the legislature to clarify the roles 18 of the different state agencies involved in these issues in order to 19 address the threat of aquatic invasive species and the problem caused 20 by aquatic freshwater algae, and to provide a dedicated fund source to 21 prevent and control further impacts.

22 **Sec. 2.** RCW 88.02.050 and 2002 c 286 s 13 are each amended to read 23 as follows:

24 (1) Application for a vessel registration shall be made to the 25 department or its authorized agent in the manner and upon forms 26 prescribed by the department. The application shall state the name and 27 address of each owner of the vessel and such other information as may 28 be required by the department, shall be signed by at least one owner,

and shall be accompanied by a vessel registration fee of ten dollars and fifty cents per year and the excise tax imposed under chapter 82.49 RCW. ((In addition, two))

4 (2) Five additional dollars must be collected annually from every
5 vessel registration application. These moneys <u>must be distributed in</u>
6 <u>the following manner:</u>

7 <u>(a) Two dollars</u> must be deposited into the derelict vessel removal 8 account established in RCW 79.100.100. If the department of natural 9 resources indicates that the balance of the derelict vessel removal 10 account reaches one million dollars as of March 1st of any year, the 11 collection of the two-dollar fee must be suspended for the following 12 fiscal year.

(b) One dollar and fifty cents must be deposited in the aquatic
 invasive species prevention account created in section 3 of this act.

15 (c) One dollar must be deposited into the freshwater aquatic algae
16 control account created in section 4 of this act.

17 (d) Fifty cents must be deposited into the aquatic invasive species
 18 enforcement account created in section 5 of this act.

19 (3) Any fees required for licensing agents under RCW 46.01.140 20 shall be in addition to the ten dollar and fifty cent annual 21 registration fee and the ((two dollar derelict vessel)) five-dollar fee 22 created in subsection (2) of this section.

(4) Upon receipt of the application and the registration fee, the 23 24 department shall assign a registration number and issue a decal for 25 each vessel. The registration number and decal shall be issued and affixed to the vessel in a manner prescribed by the department 26 27 consistent with the standard numbering system for vessels set forth in volume 33, part 174, of the code of federal regulations. A valid decal 28 affixed as prescribed shall indicate compliance with the annual 29 registration requirements of this chapter. 30

(5) The vessel registrations and decals are valid for a period of 31 32 one year, except that the director of licensing may extend or diminish vessel registration periods, and the decals therefor, for the purpose 33 of staggered renewal periods. For registration periods of more or less 34 than one year, the department may collect prorated annual registration 35 fees and excise taxes based upon the number of months in the 36 37 registration period. Vessel registrations are renewable every year in 38 a manner prescribed by the department upon payment of the vessel

1 registration fee, excise tax, and the derelict vessel fee. Upon 2 renewing a vessel registration, the department shall issue a new decal 3 to be affixed as prescribed by the department.

(6) When the department issues either a notice to renew a vessel 4 5 registration or a decal for a new or renewed vessel registration, it shall also provide information on the location of marine oil recycling б 7 tanks and sewage holding tank pumping stations. This information will be provided to the department by the state parks and recreation 8 commission in a form ready for distribution. 9 The form will be developed and prepared by the state parks and recreation commission 10 with the cooperation of the department of ecology. The department, the 11 state parks and recreation commission, and the department of ecology 12 13 shall enter into a memorandum of agreement to implement this process.

14 (7) A person acquiring a vessel from a dealer or a vessel already 15 validly registered under this chapter shall, within fifteen days of the 16 acquisition or purchase of the vessel, apply to the department or its 17 authorized agent for transfer of the vessel registration, and the 18 application shall be accompanied by a transfer fee of one dollar.

19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 77.12 RCW 20 to read as follows:

(1) The aquatic invasive species prevention account is created in the state treasury. Moneys directed to the account from RCW 88.02.050 must be deposited in the account. Expenditures from the account may only be used as provided in this section. Moneys in the account may be spent only after appropriation.

26 (2) Funds in the aquatic invasive species prevention account may be 27 appropriated to the department to develop an aquatic invasive species 28 prevention program for recreational watercraft. Funds must be expended 29 as follows:

30 (a) To inspect watercraft, watercraft trailers, and outboard motors
 31 at selected boat launching sites;

32 (b) To educate general law enforcement officers on how to enforce 33 state laws relating to preventing the spread of aquatic invasive 34 species;

35 (c) To evaluate and survey the risk posed by marine recreational 36 watercraft in spreading aquatic invasive species into Washington state 37 waters;

(d) To evaluate the risk posed by float planes in spreading aquatic
 invasive species into Washington state waters; and

3 (e) To implement an aquatic invasive species early detection and4 rapid response plan.

(3) The department shall provide training to Washington state 5 patrol employees working at port of entry weigh stations on how to 6 7 inspect recreational watercraft for the presence of zebra mussels and invasive species. The 8 other aquatic department shall also cooperatively work with the Washington state patrol to set up random 9 check stations to inspect watercraft at areas of high boating activity. 10 The department shall submit a biennial report to the 11 (4) appropriate legislative committees describing the actions taken to 12 13 implement this section along with suggestions on how to better fulfill

14 the intent of this act. The first report is due December 1, 2007.

15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 43.21A RCW 16 to read as follows:

(1) The freshwater aquatic algae control account is created in the state treasury. Moneys directed to the account from RCW 88.02.050 must be deposited in the account. Expenditures from the account may only be used as provided in this section. Moneys in the account may be spent only after appropriation.

(2) Funds in the freshwater aquatic algae control account may be
 appropriated to the department to develop a freshwater aquatic algae
 control program. Funds must be expended as follows:

(a) As grants to cities, counties, tribes, special purpose
districts, and state agencies to manage excessive freshwater algae,
with priority for the treatment of lakes in which harmful algal blooms
have occurred within the past three years; and

(b) To provide technical assistance to applicants and the publicabout aquatic algae control.

31 (3) The department shall submit a biennial report to the 32 appropriate legislative committees describing the actions taken to 33 implement this section along with suggestions on how to better fulfill 34 the intent of this act. The first report is due December 1, 2007.

35 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. A new section is added to chapter 43.43 RCW 36 to read as follows:

1 (1) The aquatic invasive species enforcement account is created in 2 the state treasury. Moneys directed to the account from RCW 88.02.050 3 must be deposited in the account. Expenditures from the account may 4 only be used as provided in this section. Moneys in the account may be 5 spent only after appropriation.

6 (2) Funds in the aquatic invasive species enforcement account may
7 be appropriated to the Washington state patrol to develop an aquatic
8 invasive species enforcement program for recreational watercraft.
9 Funds must be expended as follows:

(a) To inspect recreational watercraft that are required to stop at
port of entry weigh stations managed by the Washington state patrol.
The watercraft must be inspected for the presence of zebra mussels and
other aquatic invasive species; and

(b) To establish random check stations, in conjunction with the department of fish and wildlife, to inspect watercraft in areas of high boating activity.

17 (3) The Washington state patrol shall submit a biennial report to 18 the appropriate legislative committees describing the actions taken to 19 implement this section along with suggestions on how to better fulfill 20 the intent of this act. The first report is due December 1, 2007.

21 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 6. Section 2 of this act applies to vessel 22 registration fees that are due or become due on or after August 1, 23 2005.

24 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7. Section 2 of this act expires June 30, 25 2012."

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
