> **EFFECT:** Provides funding in the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction for the Readiness to Learn grant program. The underlying bill provides no funding for this program. Eliminates an increase for the Burke Museum at the University of Washington to enhance public outreach.

> FISCAL IMPACT: Increases the General Fund-State appropriation to OSPI by \$7,188,000. Decreases the General Fund-State appropriation to the University of Washington by \$740,000. The net impact is a decrease in General Fund-State of \$6,448,000.
