3 "<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 35.21 RCW 4 to read as follows:

5 (1) By July 1, 2008, a city or town that provides electric, natural 6 gas, water, or sewer services to retail customers must offer an 7 electronic payment option that its customers may use for payment of 8 bills for service provided through the utility. "Electronic payment option" also includes 22 an internet-based method of payment that allows a customer, at the time 23 of payment, to access an internet web page and transmit text or data 24 controlling the amount of the payment, the date of payment, and the 25 account from which the payment will be made.

26 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 35.67 RCW 27 to read as follows:

(1) By July 1, 2008, a city or town that provides sewer services toretail customers must offer an electronic payment option that its

customers may use for payment of bills for service provided through the
 utility. Additional fees or costs charged to the customer may not
 exceed the actual cost of providing an electronic payment option.

4 (2) The requirement under this section to provide an electronic
5 payment option by July 1, 2008, does not apply to a city or town that
6 provides sewer services to less than five thousand retail customer
7 accounts.

(3) For the purposes of this section, "electronic payment option" 8 means any payment system, other than a system using transactions 9 originating by check, draft, or similar paper instrument, that is 10 conducted by telephone, computer, or similar communications device. 11 12 "Electronic payment option" includes on-line credit and debit card 13 payment systems, on-line banking and money-transfer systems, and 14 electronic fund transfers. "Electronic payment option" also includes an internet-based method of payment that allows a customer, at the time 15 16 of payment, to access an internet web page and transmit text or data 17 controlling the amount of the payment, the date of payment, and the account from which the payment will be made. 18

19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 35.92 RCW 20 to read as follows:

(1) By July 1, 2008, a city or town that provides electric, natural gas, water, or sewer services to retail customers must offer an electronic payment option that its customers may use for payment of bills for service provided through the utility. Additional fees or costs charged to the customer may not exceed the actual cost of providing an electronic payment option.

(2) The requirement under this section to provide an electronic payment option by July 1, 2008, does not apply to a city or town that provides electric, natural gas, water, or sewer services to less than five thousand retail customer accounts.

(3) For the purposes of this section, "electronic payment option" means any payment system, other than a system using transactions originating by check, draft, or similar paper instrument, that is conducted by telephone, computer, or similar communications device. "Electronic payment option" includes on-line credit and debit card payment systems, on-line banking and money-transfer systems, and electronic fund transfers. "Electronic payment option" also includes

an internet-based method of payment that allows a customer, at the time of payment, to access an internet web page and transmit text or data controlling the amount of the payment, the date of payment, and the account from which the payment will be made.

7 (1) By July 1, 2008, a county that operates a sewerage or water 8 system must offer an electronic payment option that its retail 9 customers may use for payment of bills for service provided through the 10 utility. Additional fees or costs charged to the customer may not 11 exceed the actual cost of providing an electronic payment option.

12 (2) The requirement under this section to provide an electronic 13 payment option by July 1, 2008, does not apply to a county that 14 operates a sewerage or water system with less than five thousand retail 15 customer accounts.

16 (3) For the purposes of this section, "electronic payment option" 17 means any payment system, other than a system using transactions originating by check, draft, or similar paper instrument, that is 18 conducted by telephone, computer, or similar communications device. 19 20 "Electronic payment option" includes on-line credit and debit card 21 payment systems, on-line banking and money-transfer systems, and 22 electronic fund transfers. "Electronic payment option" also includes 23 an internet-based method of payment that allows a customer, at the time 24 of payment, to access an internet web page and transmit text or data controlling the amount of the payment, the date of payment, and the 25 26 account from which the payment will be made.

Additional fees or costs charged to the customer may not exceed the actual cost of providing an electronic payment option.

35 (2) The requirement under this section to provide an electronic

1 payment option by July 1, 2008, does not apply to a public utility 2 district that provides electric, water, or sewer services to less than 3 five thousand retail customer accounts.

(3) For the purposes of this section, "electronic payment option" 4 5 means any payment system, other than a system using transactions originating by check, draft, or similar paper instrument, that is 6 7 conducted by telephone, computer, or similar communications device. "Electronic payment option" includes on-line credit and debit card 8 9 payment systems, on-line banking and money-transfer systems, and 10 electronic fund transfers. "Electronic payment option" also includes an internet-based method of payment that allows a customer, at the time 11 12 of payment, to access an internet web page and transmit text or data 13 controlling the amount of the payment, the date of payment, and the 14 account from which the payment will be made.

15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 6. A new section is added to chapter 57.08 RCW 16 to read as follows:

(1) By July 1, 2008, a district that operates a sewer or water system must offer an electronic payment option that its retail customers may use for payment of bills for service provided through the district. Additional fees or costs charged to the customer may not exceed the actual cost of providing an electronic payment option.

(2) The requirement under this section to provide an electronic payment option by July 1, 2008, does not apply to a district that operates a sewer or water system with less than five thousand retail customer accounts.

26 (3) For the purposes of this section, "electronic payment option" 27 means any payment system, other than a system using transactions originating by check, draft, or similar paper instrument, that is 28 conducted by telephone, computer, or similar communications device. 29 "Electronic payment option" includes on-line credit and debit card 30 31 payment systems, on-line banking and money-transfer systems, and electronic fund transfers. "Electronic payment option" also includes 32 33 an internet-based method of payment that allows a customer, at the time 34 of payment, to access an internet web page and transmit text or data 35 controlling the amount of the payment, the date of payment, and the 36 account from which the payment will be made.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7. A new section is added to chapter 80.28 RCW
 to read as follows:

3 (1) By July 1, 2008, a gas company, electrical company, or water 4 company that provides gas, electric, or water services to retail 5 customers must offer an electronic payment option that its retail 6 customers may use for payment of bills for service provided through the 7 company. Additional fees or costs charged to the customer may not 8 exceed the actual cost of providing an electronic payment option.

9 (2) The requirement under this section to provide an electronic 10 payment option by July 1, 2008, does not apply to a gas company, 11 electrical company, or water company that provides gas, electric, or 12 water services to less than five thousand retail customer accounts.

(3) For the purposes of this section, "electronic payment option" 13 14 means any payment system, other than a system using transactions originating by check, draft, or similar paper instrument, that is 15 conducted by telephone, computer, or similar communications device. 16 17 "Electronic payment option" includes on-line credit and debit card payment systems, on-line banking and money-transfer systems, and 18 electronic fund transfers. "Electronic payment option" also includes 19 an internet-based method of payment that allows a customer, at the time 20 21 of payment, to access an internet web page and transmit text or data 22 controlling the amount of the payment, the date of payment, and the 23 account from which the payment will be made.

24 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 8. A new section is added to chapter 80.36 RCW 25 to read as follows:

(1) By July 1, 2008, a telecommunications company that provides telecommunications services to retail customers must offer an electronic payment option that its retail customers may use for payment of bills for service provided through the company. Additional fees or costs charged to the customer may not exceed the actual cost of providing an electronic payment option.

(2) The requirement under this section to provide an electronic
 payment option by July 1, 2008, does not apply to a telecommunications
 company that provides telecommunications services to less than five
 thousand retail customer accounts.

36 (3) For the purposes of this section, "electronic payment option"37 means any payment system, other than a system using transactions

originating by check, draft, or similar paper instrument, that is 1 2 conducted by telephone, computer, or similar communications device. "Electronic payment option" includes on-line credit and debit card 3 payment systems, on-line banking and money-transfer systems, and 4 5 electronic fund transfers. "Electronic payment option" also includes an internet-based method of payment that allows a customer, at the time 6 7 of payment, to access an internet web page and transmit text or data controlling the amount of the payment, the date of payment, and the 8 9 account from which the payment will be made.

10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 9. This act is necessary for the immediate 11 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the 12 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect 13 immediately."

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On page 1, line 1 of the title, after "electronically;" strike the remainder of the title and insert "adding a new section to chapter 35.21 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 35.67 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 35.92 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 36.94 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 54.16 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 57.08 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 80.28 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 80.36 RCW; and declaring an emergency."

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
