3 "<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 29A.08
4 RCW to read as follows:

5 Whenever a Washington state driver's license number, Washington 6 state identification card number, or social security card number is 7 required under this chapter for the purposes of registering to vote and 8 a person does not have either a Washington state driver's license number, Washington state identification card number, or social security 9 number, the person's enrollment card issued by the governing authority 10 11 of a federally recognized Indian tribe in Washington shall satisfy the 12 requirement.

13 Sec. 2. RCW 66.16.040 and 2004 c 61 s 1 are each amended to read 14 as follows:

Except as otherwise provided by law, an employee in a state liquor store or agency may sell liquor to any person of legal age to purchase alcoholic beverages and may also sell to holders of permits such liquor as may be purchased under such permits.

Where there may be a question of a person's right to purchase liquor by reason of age, such person shall be required to present any one of the following officially issued cards of identification which shows his/her correct age and bears his/her signature and photograph:

(1) Liquor control authority card of identification of any state orprovince of Canada.

(2) Driver's license, instruction permit or identification card of
 any state or province of Canada, or "identicard" issued by the
 Washington state department of licensing pursuant to RCW 46.20.117.

28 (3) United States armed forces identification card issued to active

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1 duty, reserve, and retired personnel and the personnel's dependents, 2 which may include an imbedded, digital signature in lieu of a visible 3 signature.

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(4) Passport.

5 (5) Merchant Marine identification card issued by the United States 6 Coast Guard.

7 (6) Enrollment card issued by the governing authority of a federally recognized Indian tribe located in Washington, if the 8 enrollment card incorporates security features comparable to those 9 implemented by the department of licensing for Washington drivers' 10 licenses. At least ninety days prior to implementation of an 11 enrollment card under this subsection, the appropriate tribal authority 12 shall give notice to the board. The board shall publish and 13 communicate to licensees regarding the implementation of each new 14 enrollment card. 15

16 The board may adopt such regulations as it deems proper covering 17 the cards of identification listed in this section.

18 No liquor sold under this section shall be delivered until the 19 purchaser has paid for the liquor in cash, except as allowed under RCW 20 66.16.041. The use of a personal credit card does not rely upon the 21 credit of the state as prohibited by Article VIII, section 5 of the 22 state Constitution.

23 **Sec. 3.** RCW 70.155.090 and 1993 c 507 s 10 are each amended to 24 read as follows:

(1) Where there may be a question of a person's right to purchase 25 26 or obtain tobacco products by reason of age, the retailer, sampler, or agent thereof, shall require the purchaser to present any one of the 27 following officially issued identification that shows the purchaser's 28 age and bears his or her signature and photograph: (a) Liquor control 29 authority card of identification of a state or province of Canada; (b) 30 31 driver's license, instruction permit, or identification card of a state or province of Canada; (c) "identicard" issued by the Washington state 32 department of licensing under chapter 46.20 RCW; (d) United States 33 34 military identification; (e) passport; (f) enrollment card, issued by the governing authority of a federally recognized Indian tribe located 35 36 in Washington, that incorporates security features comparable to those implemented by the department of licensing for Washington drivers' 37

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1 licenses. At least ninety days prior to implementation of an 2 enrollment card under this subsection, the appropriate tribal authority 3 shall give notice to the board. The board shall publish and 4 communicate to licensees regarding the implementation of each new 5 enrollment card; or (g) merchant marine identification card issued by 6 the United States coast guard.

7 (2) It is a defense to a prosecution under RCW 26.28.080(((4))) 8 that the person making a sale reasonably relied on any of the 9 officially issued identification as defined in subsection (1) of this 10 section. The liquor control board shall waive the suspension or 11 revocation of a license if the licensee clearly establishes that he or 12 she acted in good faith to prevent violations and a violation occurred 13 despite the licensee's exercise of due diligence.

14 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. Section 1 of this act takes effect January 15 1, 2006."

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16 On page 1, line 2 of the title, after "tribes;" strike the 17 remainder of the title and insert "amending RCW 66.16.040 and 18 70.155.090; adding a new section to chapter 29A.08 RCW; and providing 19 an effective date."

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
