Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the following:

3 "<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 39.10 RCW 4 to read as follows:

5 (1) The capital projects advisory review board is created in the 6 department of general administration to provide an evaluation of public 7 capital projects construction processes, including the impact of 8 contracting methods on project outcomes, and to advise the legislature 9 on policies related to alternative public works delivery methods.

10 (2)(a) The capital projects advisory review board shall consist of 11 the following members appointed by the governor: One representative 12 from construction general contracting; one representative from the design industries; two representatives from construction specialty 13 14 subcontracting; one representative from a construction trades labor organization; one representative from the office of minority and 15 16 women's business enterprises; one representative from a higher education institution; one representative from the department of 17 general administration; and one representative of a domestic insurer 18 authorized to write surety bonds for contractors in Washington state. 19 20 All appointed members must be actively engaged in or authorized to use 21 alternative public works contracting procedures.

(b) Two members shall be at-large positions representing local public owners. The two at-large positions shall serve on a rotating basis to be determined and appointed by the association of Washington cities, the Washington state association of counties, and the Washington public ports association.

(c) One member shall be a member of the public hospital district
project review board, selected by that board, who shall be nonvoting.
(d) One member shall be a member of the school district project
review board, selected by that board, who shall be nonvoting.

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1 (e) The advisory review board shall include two members of the 2 house of representatives, one from each major caucus, appointed by the 3 speaker of the house of representatives, and two members of the senate, 4 one from each major caucus, appointed by the president of the senate. 5 Legislative members are nonvoting.

6 (3) Members selected under subsection (2)(a) of this section shall 7 serve for terms of four years, with the terms expiring on June 30th on 8 the fourth year of the term. However, in the case of the initial 9 members, four members shall serve four-year terms, four members shall 10 serve three-year terms, and three members shall serve a two-year term, 11 with each of the terms expiring on June 30th of the applicable year. 12 Appointees may be reappointed to serve more than one term.

13 (4) The capital projects advisory review board chair is selected 14 from among the appointed members by the majority vote of the voting 15 members.

16 (5) Legislative members of the capital projects advisory review 17 board shall be reimbursed for travel expenses in accordance with RCW 18 44.04.120. Nonlegislative members of the capital projects advisory 19 review board, including any subcommittee members, except those 20 representing an employer or organization, shall be reimbursed for 21 travel expenses as provided in RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060.

(6) If a vacancy occurs of the appointive members of the board, the governor shall fill the vacancy for the unexpired term. Members of the board may be removed for malfeasance or misfeasance in office, upon specific written charges by the governor, under chapter 34.05 RCW.

26 (7) The capital projects advisory review board shall convene as 27 soon as practical after July 1, 2005, and may meet as often as 28 necessary thereafter.

(8) Capital projects advisory review board members are expected to consistently attend review board meetings. The chair of the capital projects advisory review board may ask the governor to remove any member who misses more than two meetings in any calendar year without cause.

(9) The department of general administration shall provide staff
 support as may be required for the proper discharge of the function of
 the capital projects advisory review board.

37 (10) The capital projects advisory review board may establish

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subcommittees as it desires and may invite nonmembers of the capital
 projects advisory review board to serve as committee members.

3 (11) The board shall encourage participation from persons and 4 entities not represented on the capital projects advisory review board.

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 39.10 RCW 6 to read as follows:

7 The capital projects advisory review board has the following powers 8 and duties:

9 (1) Develop and recommend to the legislature criteria that may be 10 used to determine effective and feasible use of alternative contracting 11 procedures;

12 (2) Develop and recommend to the legislature qualification 13 standards for general contractors bidding on alternative public works 14 projects;

15 (3) Develop and recommend to the legislature policies to further 16 enhance the quality, efficiency, and accountability of capital 17 construction projects through the use of traditional and alternative delivery methods in Washington, and make recommendations regarding 18 continuation, 19 expansion, elimination, or modification of the 20 alternative public works contracting methods;

(4) Evaluate the potential future use of other alternativecontracting procedures including competitive negotiation contracts.

23 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 39.10 RCW 24 to read as follows:

25 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, and after complying with RCW 39.10.030, any city that: (1) is located in a county 26 authorized under this chapter to use alternative public works 27 procedures or is located in a county that is a member of the Puget 28 29 Sound regional council; (2) reports in the state auditor's local 30 government financial reporting system combined general fund, special revenue, debt service, capital projects, and enterprise funds revenues 31 that exceed sixty million dollars; and (3) has a population greater 32 than twenty-five thousand but less then forty-five thousand, 33 is 34 authorized to use the general contractor/construction manager or 35 design-build procedure for one demonstration project valued over ten 36 million dollars.

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1 All contracts authorized under this section must be entered into 2 before March 1, 2006.

3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. If specific funding for the purposes of this 4 act, referencing this act by bill or chapter number, is not provided by 5 June 30, 2005, in the omnibus appropriations act, sections 1 and 2 of 6 this act are null and void."

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7 On page 1, line 1 of the title, after "procedures;" strike the 8 remainder of the title and insert "adding new sections to chapter 39.10 9 RCW; and creating a new section."

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
