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- (2) The study shall include:
- (a) Whether a log is an effective law enforcement tool;
- 8 (b) What information is needed to make logs useful as a deterrent 9 to criminal activity;
- 10 (c) The most effective method of obtaining, recording, and storing log information in the least intrusive manner available;
- 12 (d) How long the information recorded in the logs should be 13 maintained; and

- 17 (a) One representative from law enforcement appointed by the Washington association of sheriffs and police chiefs;

- 23 (d) One representative appointed by the state board of pharmacy; 24 and
- 25 (e) Two representatives from the retail industry.
- 26 (4) The state board of pharmacy shall report to the legislature no 27 later than November 30, 2005, regarding the findings of the work group
- 28 along with any recommendations or proposed legislation."
