EFFECT: Requires the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction to direct school districts receiving transitional bilingual program funding to implement a transition towards implementing an intensive one year only transitional bilingual program. The legislative intent is that all students enrolled in the transitional bilingual program will be limited to one year by the 2007-08 school year, except in rare cases. The level of per student funding is increased by approximately 12 percent to accommodate the more intensive model. However, the increased costs are most than offset by an assumed reduction in enrollment from the implementation of the one year intensive model. The net effect is a GF-S decrease of \$15.3 million for the 2005-07 biennium.
