## **SSB 6821** - S AMD 132

"NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature recognizes that the state 3 4 has committed itself to providing educational opportunities to students 5 until age twenty-one or until they receive a high school diploma, 6 whichever occurs first. The legislature further recognizes that the 7 purpose of education reform has been to assure that all students are 8 provided a rigorous educational experience that will prepare them for college or the work force. The legislature understands, however, that 9 all students have different learning styles and learn at different 10 11 rates and that some may require more time to earn a diploma than the 12 standard four years of high school. For these older students, the legislature recognizes that additional opportunities outside of the 13 14 traditional high school classroom may be necessary. It is the intent 15 of the legislature to explore what learning environments are best 16 suited to helping students access the knowledge and skills necessary to become college or career ready. 17

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. (1) To the extent funds are appropriated, 18 the office of the superintendent of public instruction in conjunction 19 20 with the higher education coordinating board and the state board for 21 community and technical colleges, shall convene a work group to explore 22 the creation of college and career readiness centers as a way to provide additional learning opportunities for students in middle 23 24 school, high school, and beyond high school, up to age twenty-one, who 25 are at a risk of not graduating from high school with their peers. The 26 work group shall, at a minimum, consider the following issues:

27 (a) Where college and career readiness centers should be located;

28 (b) How to best administer the educational program at the centers

in order to provide students with a flexible learning environment that accommodates the needs of students, including instructional activities and support;

4 (c) How students, parents, and the community should be provided 5 information about college and career readiness centers;

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(d) Funding mechanisms for college and career readiness centers;

7 (e) Eligibility criteria for college and career readiness centers;8 and

(f) How a community-school district partnership involving parents, 9 youth organizations, institutions of higher education, and other 10 community leaders of community organizations could be brought together 11 to help implement college and career readiness centers that would 12 support students with diverse learning styles and strategies who may 13 have unique problems and barriers to success in public high schools. 14 In considering the development and implementation of a community-school 15 16 district partnership, the work group shall consider and make recommendations regarding the use of demonstration projects to pilot 17 this option, including a time frame and cost for implementation. 18

(2) The work group shall include representatives of the followinggroups, agencies, and organizations:

21 (a) The office of the superintendent of public instruction;

22 (b) The state board of education;

23 (c) Teachers and faculty from the K-12 and higher education system;

- 24 (d) School administrators;
- 25 (e) School counselors;
- 26 (f) Educational service districts;
- 27 (g) Institutions of higher education;
- 28 (h) Work force training and education coordinating board;

29 (i) Representatives of cultural, linguistic, and racial minority 30 groups;

(k) Representatives of federally recognized Washington tribes;

- 31 (j) Representatives of the business community;
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- (1) Skill centers; and
- 34 (m) Other interested organizations and personnel.
