Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the following:

"<u>NEW SECTION</u>. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that economic 3 4 development success requires coordinated state and local efforts. 5 Associate development organizations serve as a networking tool and 6 resource hub for business retention, expansion, and relocation in 7 Washington. Economic development success requires an adequately funded 8 and coordinated state effort and an adequately funded and coordinated 9 The legislature intends to bolster the partnership local effort. between state and local economic development efforts, provide increased 10 11 funding for local economic development services, and increase local 12 economic development service effectiveness, efficiency, and outcomes.

13 Sec. 2. RCW 43.330.080 and 1997 c 60 s 1 are each amended to read 14 as follows:

15 (1) The department shall contract with <u>county designated</u> associate development organizations ((or other local organizations)) to increase 16 17 the support for and coordination of community and economic development services in communities or regional areas. 18 The organizations 19 contracted with in each community or regional area shall be broadly 20 representative of community and economic interests. The organization 21 shall be capable of identifying key economic and community development 22 problems, developing appropriate solutions, and mobilizing broad support for recommended initiatives. The contracting organization 23 shall work with and include local governments, local chambers of 24 25 commerce, ((private industry councils,)) workforce developing councils, 26 port districts, labor groups, institutions of higher education, 27 community action programs, and other appropriate private, public, or 28 nonprofit community and economic development groups. The ((department

shall be responsible for determining the)) scope of services delivered under these contracts((-

3 (2) Associate development organizations or other local development 4 organizations contracted with shall promote and coordinate, through 5 local service agreements with local governments, small business 6 development centers, port districts, community and technical colleges, 7 private industry councils, and other development organizations, for the 8 efficient delivery of community and economic development services in 9 their areas.

(3) The department shall consult with associate development 10 organizations, port districts, local governments, and other local 11 development organizations in the establishment of service delivery 12 13 regions throughout the state. The legislature encourages local associate development organizations to form partnerships with other 14 associate development organizations in their region to combine 15 resources for better access to available services, to encourage 16 regional delivery of state services, and to build the local capacity of 17 18 communities in the region more effectively.

(4) The department shall contract on a regional basis for surveys 19 of key sectors of the regional economy and the coordination of 20 21 technical assistance to businesses and employees within the key sectors. The department's selection of contracting organizations or 2.2 23 consortiums shall be based on the sufficiency of the organization's or 24 consortium's proposal to examine key sectors of the local economy within its region adequately and its ability to coordinate the delivery 25 26 of services required by businesses within the targeted sectors. 27 Organizations contracting with the department shall work closely with the department to examine the local economy and to develop strategies 28 to focus on developing key sectors that show potential for long-term 29 sustainable growth. The contracting organization shall survey 30 businesses and employees in targeted sectors on a periodic basis to 31 gather information on the sector's business needs, expansion plans, 32 relocation decisions, training needs, potential layoffs, financing 33 needs, availability of financing, and other appropriate information 34 35 about economic trends and specific employer and employee needs in the 36 region.

37 (5) The contracting organization shall participate with the
38 workforce training and education coordinating board as created in

chapter 28C.18 RCW, and any regional entities designated by that board, 1 2 in providing for the coordination of job skills training within its 3 region)) shall include: 4 (a) The development of a countywide economic development plan with other economic development partners, consistent with the state 5 comprehensive plan for economic development developed by the state 6 economic development commission; 7 (b) Responding to inquiries regarding sites available for 8 development, and assisting businesses in site location and selection; 9 (c) Collecting and maintaining demographic, labor market, and other 10 data for use by firms making location decision and to inform local, 11 12 regional, and statewide strategic decisions and plans; 13 (d) Providing directly, or coordinating the delivery of, permit and licensing assistance and information on tax issues to businesses 14 seeking to locate or expand in the county; 15 (e) Marketing the county and the state as an excellent location to 16 expand or locate a business, in coordination with the department's 17 marketing efforts; 18 (f) Identifying gaps in the delivery of business start-up 19 assistance and coordinating efforts with local small business 20 21 development centers and other assistance providers to fill the gaps; (q) Providing business retention and expansion services, including 22 business surveys and outreach efforts, early detection of potential 23 24 relocations or layoffs, and identification of employers' needs; (h) Partnering with local governments, workforce development 25 organizations, port districts, export assistance providers, local 26 27 colleges and universities, the Washington state quality award council, the Washington manufacturing service, small business development 28 centers, and other programs to facilitate the alignment of planning 29 efforts and the seamless delivery of business support services in the 30 31 county; 32 (i) Collecting and maintaining data as specified by the state economic development commission for use in program and system 33 34 evaluation; and (j) Participating in region-wide economic development planning and 35 research to identify customer needs, identify gaps in services, and 36 identify methods and organizations available to meet business needs. 37 Additional regional efforts shall include working with regional 38

partners to identify opportunities for promoting increased
competitiveness of firms within the region and to coordinate and align
regional workforce development and economic development efforts.

4 (2) Associate development organizations contracting with the 5 department under this act that apply for the Washington state quality 6 award or its equivalent shall receive a ten thousand dollar award but 7 may not receive this award more than once every three years.

8 (3) The contracting organization shall participate with the state 9 board for community and technical colleges as created in RCW 10 28B.50.050, and any community or technical colleges designated by that 11 board, in providing for the coordination of job skills training within 12 its region.

13 NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. (1) Contracting associate development organizations shall provide the department with measures of their 14 performance. Annual reports shall include information on the impact of 15 16 the contracting organization on employment, wages, tax revenue, and 17 capital investment. Specific measures consistent with the requirements of RCW 43.330.080(1) and the direction provided by the economic 18 development commission shall be developed in the contracting process 19 20 between the department and the contracting organization every two 21 years. Performance measures should be consistent across regions to allow for statewide evaluation. 22

(2) The department and contracting organizations shall agree upon specific target levels for the performance measures developed as provided in subsection (1) of this section. Comparison of agreed thresholds and actual performance shall occur annually."

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27 On page 1, line 2 of the title, after "services;" strike the 28 remainder of the title and insert "amending RCW 43.330.080; adding new 29 sections to chapter 43.330 RCW; and creating a new section." <u>EFFECT:</u> The development of countywide economic development plans is to be done with other economic development partners. The ADOs are to respond to inquiries regarding available development sites and assist businesses in site location and selection, rather than provide an inventory of sites. Demographic, labor market, and other data collected by ADOs is to be for use by firms making location decision and to inform local, regional, and statewide strategic decisions and plans. The obligation to facilitate the alignment of planning efforts and the seamless delivery of business support services is to be done with other programs, as well as those specifically listed.

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
