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## <u>2SHB 1716</u> - S COMM AMD By Committee on Early Learning & K-12 Education

1 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the 2 following:

"NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that the educational

4 achievement of children in foster care continues to be significantly 5 lower than students in the general population. Children in foster care 6 are more likely to change schools frequently, be retained and repeat 7 a grade, perform at lower levels on standardized tests, and graduate at 8 a significantly lower rate than their peers. An important strategy for 9 supporting the educational progress of children in foster care is to facilitate continuity of school placement when children are removed 10 11 from their homes or when subsequent changes in placement are necessary. 12 The legislature also finds that the primary barriers to continuity of 13 school placement are inadequate numbers of local foster homes and a 14 lack of funding to provide transportation when local placements are not 15 Despite some efforts to support continuity of school available. 16 placement for children in foster care, limited progress has been made. legislature further finds that an additional factor 17 18 supporting improved educational outcomes for children in foster care is timely data collection and analysis. Aggregate reporting about the 19 20 educational attainment of children in foster care is crucial to understanding and assessing the impact of policy and practice changes 21 22 on educational outcomes. The legislature, therefore, intends to 23 promote the development, implementation, and evaluation of innovative and practical strategies for maintaining continuity of school placement 24 for children in foster care, and to facilitate data sharing between the 25 26 office of the superintendent of public instruction and the children's 27 administration within the department of social and health services.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. (1) Subject to availability of funding amounts appropriated for this specific purpose, the oversight committee

- established in RCW 74.13.570, by August 1, 2007, shall: (a) Select 1 2 stakeholders to assist the committee with facilitating innovation and effectiveness in the recruitment and retention of foster parents; (b) 3 identify promising and effective strategies for school enrollment 4 stabilization; (c) select strategies for implementation and evaluation 5 in the ten school districts with the highest rate of removal of school-6 7 age children from their homes under chapter 13.34 RCW; and (d) develop a request for qualification to community agencies and the division of 8 children and family services within the department of social and health 9 10 services for grant funding to implement school enrollment stabilization strategies. Such strategies may include practice pilot programs 11 designed to affect a geographical cohort of children as well as 12 programs using child-specific strategies to maintain school enrollment 13 stability, including but not limited to strategies relating to: (i) 14 Foster parent recruitment, retention, and support; (ii) transportation 15 within and between school districts; (iii) incentives for schools, 16 foster parents, and regional offices of the division of children and 17 family services to support enrollment stability; (iv) funding of 18 individual safety and services plan-driven strategies for individual 19 children; and (v) public relations and communications campaigns 20 21 regarding the needs of children in foster care and the opportunities in 22 foster parenting.
  - (2) Based on the recommendations of the oversight committee, the department of social and health services shall select grant recipients and begin disbursing grant funds not later than October 31, 2007. The committee shall, to the extent practicable, provide technical support and assistance to the grant recipients with implementation and data collection.
  - (3) By July 31, 2009, the department of social and health services shall inform the appropriate committees of the legislature about the strategies and practices implemented, and shall make additional policy recommendations based on evaluations of the same.
    - (4) This section expires September 1, 2009.

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- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 28A.150 RCW to read as follows:
- 36 Subject to availability of funding amounts for this specific 37 purpose, not later than January 1, 2008, the office of the

superintendent of public instruction shall facilitate interagency 1 2 agreements consistent with protocols developed under RCW 74.13.560 and execute data-sharing agreements with and between local school districts 3 and the children's administration within the department of social and 4 5 health services for the purposes of: (1) Promoting school enrollment continuity of children in foster care; and (2) evaluating and analyzing 6 7 the impact of changes to state, school district, and department policies and practices on the educational outcomes of children in 8 foster care. Data-sharing agreements required under this section shall 9 10 include state and school district-level data as well as data about individual children in foster care. In executing the data-sharing 11 agreements, the children's administration shall give priority to those 12 13 school districts most impacted by ongoing enrollment of students in 14 foster care, foster care removals, and placements. This section permits a school, a school district, or the office of 15 16 superintendent of public instruction to release personally identifiable 17 information only as allowed under the federal family 18 educational rights and privacy act.

19 **Sec. 4.** RCW 28A.150.510 and 2000 c 88 s 1 are each amended to read 20 as follows:

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In order to effectively serve students who are under the jurisdiction of the juvenile justice system as dependent pursuant to chapter 13.34 RCW, education records shall be ((released upon request to)) transmitted to the department of social and health services within two school days after receiving the request from the department ((of social and health services)) provided that the department of social and health services certifies that it will not disclose to any other party the education records without prior written consent of the parent or student unless authorized to disclose the records under state law. The department of social and health services is authorized to disclose education records it obtains pursuant to this section to a foster parent, guardian, or other entity authorized by the department of social and health services to provide residential care to the student.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. A new section is added to chapter 43.20A RCW to read as follows:

The children's administration within the department of social and

- health services shall request funding and/or approval necessary to 1 2 expedite the development and implementation of an interface between the statewide automated child welfare information system and the 3 information system within the office of the superintendent of public 4 5 instruction in order to facilitate ongoing effective data sharing between the two agencies regarding the educational achievement of 6 children in foster care. This section permits the office of the 7 superintendent of public instruction to release personally identifiable 8 information only as allowed under the federal 9 educational rights and privacy act. 10
- 11 **Sec. 6.** RCW 74.13.560 and 2003 c 112 s 3 are each amended to read 12 as follows:
- The administrative regions of the department shall develop 13 protocols with the respective school districts in their regions, 14 prioritizing those districts that have the highest number of children 15 in foster care and/or high numbers of foster care removals and 16 17 placements, specifying specific strategies for communication, coordination, and collaboration regarding the status and progress of 18 foster children placed in the region, in order to maximize the 19 20 educational continuity and achievement for foster children. The 21 protocols shall include methods to assure effective sharing of information consistent with RCW 28A.225.330." 22

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On page 1, line 2 of the title, after "care;" strike the remainder of the title and insert "amending RCW 28A.150.510 and 74.13.560; adding a new section to chapter 28A.150 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 43.20A RCW; creating new sections; and providing an expiration date."

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
