1 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the
2 following:

3 "Sec. 1. RCW 28A.210.080 and 2005 c 404 s 1 are each amended to
4 read as follows:

5 (1) The attendance of every child at every public and private
6 school in the state and licensed day care center shall be conditioned
7 upon the presentation before or on each child's first day of attendance
8 at a particular school or center, of proof of either (a) full
9 immunization, (b) the initiation of and compliance with a schedule of
10 immunization, as required by rules of the state board of health, or (c)
11 a certificate of exemption as provided for in RCW 28A.210.090. The
12 attendance at the school or the day care center during any subsequent
13 school year of a child who has initiated a schedule of immunization
14 shall be conditioned upon the presentation of proof of compliance with
15 the schedule on the child's first day of attendance during the
16 subsequent school year. Once proof of full immunization or proof of
17 completion of an approved schedule has been presented, no further proof
18 shall be required as a condition to attendance at the particular school
19 or center.

20 (2)(a) Beginning with sixth grade entry, every public and private
21 school in the state shall provide parents and guardians with
22 information about meningococcal disease and its vaccine at the
23 beginning of every school year. The information about meningococcal
24 disease shall include:

25 (i) Its causes and symptoms, how meningococcal disease is spread,
26 and the places where parents and guardians may obtain additional
27 information and vaccinations for their children; and

28 (ii) Current recommendations from the United States centers for
29 disease control and prevention regarding the receipt of vaccines for
30 meningococcal disease and where the vaccination can be received.

1 (b) This subsection shall not be construed to require the
2 department of health or the school to provide meningococcal vaccination
3 to students.

4 (c) The department of health shall prepare the informational
5 materials and shall consult with the office of superintendent of public
6 instruction.

7 (d) This subsection does not create a private right of action.

8 (3)(a) Beginning with sixth grade entry, every public school in the
9 state shall provide parents and guardians with information about human
10 papillomavirus disease and its vaccine at the beginning of every school
11 year. The information about human papillomavirus disease shall
12 include:

13 (i) Its causes and symptoms, how human papillomavirus disease is
14 spread, and the places where parents and guardians may obtain
15 additional information and vaccinations for their children; and

16 (ii) Current recommendations from the United States centers for
17 disease control and prevention regarding the receipt of vaccines for
18 human papillomavirus disease and where the vaccination can be received.

19 (b) This subsection shall not be construed to require the
20 department of health or the school to provide human papillomavirus
21 vaccination to students.

22 (c) The department of health shall prepare the informational
23 materials and shall consult with the office of the superintendent of
24 public instruction.

25 (d) This subsection does not create a private right of action.

26 (4) Private schools are required by state law to notify parents
27 that information on the human papillomavirus disease prepared by the
28 department of health is available."

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29 On page 1, line 2 of the title, after "vaccine;" strike the
30 remainder of the title and insert "and amending RCW 28A.210.080."

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
