1 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the 2 following:

"NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The field of dreams program is established. 3 4 The legislature finds that agriculture is a major and critical employer 5 in Washington state and recognizes that the industry is struggling to 6 attract and retain employees. The purpose of the program is to provide 7 college tuition in the form of GET units to students working for agricultural employers to benefit the agriculture industry and to 8 9 assist students in accessing postsecondary education. The program 10 shall be administered by the employment security department and the GET units shall be administered by the higher education coordinating board. 11

NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. The definitions in this section apply 12 throughout this chapter unless the context clearly requires otherwise. 13 14

(1) "Board" means the higher education coordinating board.

15 (2) "Department" means the employment security department.

(3) "GET units" means tuition units under the advanced college 16 17 tuition payment program in chapter 28B.95 RCW.

(4) "Institution of higher education" has the same meaning as in 18 19 RCW 28B.92.030.

20 (5) "Qualified employer" means an employer whose American industry 21 classification system (NAICS) code is within "111" or "112."

22 (6) "WorkSource" means one-stop delivery system as described in P.L. 105-220, Section 134. 23

24 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. (1) To be eligible for the field of dreams 25 GET units, a student must be enrolled in the field of dreams program. 26 To enroll, a student must:

27 (a) Meet the criteria for resident tuition and fee rates as defined in RCW 28B.15.012; 28

- (b) Be sixteen through twenty-one years of age;

2 (c) Register at WorkSource;

(d) Work for a qualified employer in an agricultural job; and 3

(e) Be enrolled in high school, have graduated from high school, or 4 5 hold a general equivalency diploma.

6

(2) To accrue GET units, a student shall:

7 (a) Register with WorkSource each time he or she accepts employment with an agricultural employer under the field of dreams program to 8 9 verify that the employment meets the qualifications of this program and that work hours are being counted; 10

11

(b) Work in a position at a qualified employer; and

(c) Consent to the disclosure of information or records deemed 12 private and confidential under chapter 50.13 RCW. Disclosure of this 13 information and these records by the department to the board shall be 14 solely for purposes related to the administration of this chapter. 15 16 Information obtained from employer records under this chapter is 17 confidential and not open to public inspection, other than to public employees in the performance of their official duties. 18

19 (3) For each three hundred fifty hours worked for a qualified employer, a student shall earn ten GET units. GET units are not 20 available in denominations fewer than ten. No partial credit shall be 21 awarded for less than three hundred fifty hours of employment. 22

23 (4) Students may earn a maximum of one hundred GET units.

24

(5) To receive GET units a student shall:

25 (a) Obtain a certificate verifying units earned from the WorkSource office; and 26

27 (b) Enter an institution of higher education that is accredited by an accrediting agency recognized by rule of the higher education 28 29 coordinating board.

30 (6) GET units awarded through the field of dreams program may only 31 be used for payment of qualified higher education expenses as detailed 32 by the GET program.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. (1) The department is responsible for 33 administering the field of dreams program. In this capacity, the 34 department shall: 35

36 (a) Inform WorkSource applicants about the program; (b) Manage student enrollment in the program, including outreach
 to schools, subject to funds appropriated for the specific purpose of
 the field of dreams program;

4 (c) Track student hours worked through the unemployment insurance5 system;

б

(d) Refer interested students to qualified employers;

7 (e) Provide verification of covered employment under Title 50 RCW
8 and verify that the student is working for a qualified employer;

9 (f) Work with the board to develop appropriate procedures for the 10 redemption of certificates for GET units awarded by the program; and

(g) Use information sharing and integration technology to facilitate the disclosure of relevant information and records by the employment security department, so long as an individual consents to the disclosure as required under section 3(2) of this act.

(2) Information contained in the files and records pertaining to an 15 16 individual under this chapter are confidential and not open to public 17 inspection, other than to public employees in the performance of their official duties. However, an individual 18 or an authorized representative of the individual may review his or her records or 19 receive specific information from the records on the presentation of 20 21 the signed authorization of the individual.

22 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** The board shall administer GET units earned 23 through the field of dreams program. In this capacity, the board 24 shall:

(1) Purchase GET units to be owned and held in trust by the board,
for the purpose of field of dreams awards as provided for in this
section;

(2) Distribute award funds, in the form of GET units, to
institutions of higher education on behalf of eligible recipients
identified by the program administrator beginning on July 1, 2011;

(3) Work with the department to develop appropriate procedures forthe redemption of certificates for GET units;

(4) Provide annual reports to the appropriate higher education and fiscal committees of the house of representatives and the senate regarding use of GET units, enrollment, and graduation information of GET field of dreams recipients, if the recipients have given permission for the board to do so; and (5) Submit a report, developed jointly with the department, to the appropriate higher education and fiscal committees of the house of representatives and the senate by December 1, 2011, December 1, 2013, and December 1, 2015, that describes the utilization of the program. The reports shall include, but are not limited to, the demographic, geographic, and income distribution of the student participants.

7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 6. (1) The GET field of dreams account is 8 created in the custody of the state treasurer.

9 (2) The board shall deposit into the account all money received for 10 the GET field of dreams account from appropriations and private 11 sources. The account shall be self-sustaining.

(3) Expenditures from the account shall be used for purchases of
 GET units. Purchased GET units shall be owned and held in trust by the
 board.

15 (4) With the exception of the operating costs associated with the 16 management of the account by the treasurer's office as authorized in 17 chapter 43.79A RCW, the account shall be credited with all investment 18 income earned by the account.

19 (5) Disbursements from the account are exempt from appropriations20 and the allotment provisions of chapter 43.88 RCW.

(6) Disbursements from the account shall be made only on the authorization of the board.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. This chapter expires December 31, 2015.

24 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 8. A new section is added to chapter 28B.95 RCW 25 to read as follows:

(1) Ownership of tuition units purchased by the higher education coordinating board for the GET field of dreams program under section 5 of this act shall be in the name of the state of Washington and may be redeemed by the state of Washington on behalf of recipients of GET field of dreams awards for tuition and fees.

31 (2) This section expires December 31, 2015.

32 **Sec. 9.** RCW 28B.95.060 and 2007 c 214 s 13 are each amended to 33 read as follows:

34 (1) The Washington advanced college tuition payment program account

is created in the custody of the state treasurer. The account shall be
 a discrete nontreasury account retaining its interest earnings in
 accordance with RCW 43.79A.040.

(2)(a) Except as provided in (b) and (c) of this subsection, the 4 governing body shall deposit in the account all money received for the 5 program. The account shall be self-sustaining and consist of payments 6 7 received from purchasers of tuition units and funds received from other sources, public or private. With the exception of investment and 8 operating costs associated with the investment of money by the 9 10 investment board paid under RCW 43.33A.160 and 43.84.160, the account shall be credited with all investment income earned by the account. 11 12 Disbursements from the account are exempt from appropriations and the 13 allotment provisions of chapter 43.88 RCW. Money used for program 14 administration is subject to the allotment of all expenditures. However, an appropriation is not required for such expenditures. 15 Program administration shall include, but not be limited to: 16 The 17 salaries and expenses of the program personnel including lease payments, travel, and goods and services necessary for program 18 operation; contracts for program promotion and advertisement, audits, 19 and account management; and other general costs of conducting the 20 21 business of the program.

(b) All money received by the program from the higher education coordinating board for the GET ready for math and science scholarship program shall be deposited in the GET ready for math and science scholarship account created in RCW 28B.105.110.

26 (c) All money received by the program from the higher education 27 coordinating board for the GET field of dreams program shall be 28 deposited in the GET field of dreams account created in section 6 of 29 this act.

30 (3) The assets of the account may be spent without appropriation 31 for the purpose of making payments to institutions of higher education 32 on behalf of the qualified beneficiaries, making refunds, transfers, or 33 direct payments upon the termination of the Washington advanced college 34 tuition payment program. Disbursements from the account shall be made 35 only on the authorization of the governing body.

36 (4) With regard to the assets of the account, the state acts in a37 fiduciary, not ownership, capacity. Therefore the assets of the

1 program are not considered state money, common cash, or revenue to the 2 state.

3 Sec. 10. RCW 43.79A.040 and 2007 c 523 s 5, 2007 c 357 s 21, and 4 2007 c 214 s 14 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

5 (1) Money in the treasurer's trust fund may be deposited, invested, 6 and reinvested by the state treasurer in accordance with RCW 43.84.080 7 in the same manner and to the same extent as if the money were in the 8 state treasury.

9 (2) All income received from investment of the treasurer's trust 10 fund shall be set aside in an account in the treasury trust fund to be 11 known as the investment income account.

(3) The investment income account may be utilized for the payment 12 of purchased banking services on behalf of treasurer's trust funds 13 not limited to, depository, safekeeping, and 14 including, but disbursement functions for the state treasurer or affected state 15 16 agencies. The investment income account is subject in all respects to chapter 43.88 RCW, but no appropriation is required for payments to 17 financial institutions. Payments shall occur prior to distribution of 18 earnings set forth in subsection (4) of this section. 19

20 (4)(a) Monthly, the state treasurer shall distribute the earnings 21 credited to the investment income account to the state general fund 22 except under (b) and (c) of this subsection.

(b) The following accounts and funds shall receive their 23 24 proportionate share of earnings based upon each account's or fund's average daily balance for the period: The Washington promise 25 26 scholarship account, the college savings program account, the Washington advanced college tuition payment program account, the 27 agricultural local fund, the American Indian scholarship endowment 28 fund, the foster care scholarship endowment fund, the foster care 29 30 endowed scholarship trust fund, the students with dependents grant 31 account, the basic health plan self-insurance reserve account, the contract harvesting revolving account, the Washington state combined 32 fund drive account, the commemorative works account, the Washington 33 international exchange scholarship endowment fund, the developmental 34 disabilities endowment trust fund, the energy account, the fair fund, 35 36 the family leave insurance account, the fruit and vegetable inspection 37 account, the future teachers conditional scholarship account, the game

farm alternative account, the GET field of dreams account, the GET 1 2 ready for math and science scholarship account, the grain inspection revolving fund, the juvenile accountability incentive account, the law 3 enforcement officers' and firefighters' plan 2 expense fund, the local 4 5 tourism promotion account, the produce railcar pool account, the regional transportation investment district account, the rural 6 7 rehabilitation account, the stadium and exhibition center account, the youth athletic facility account, the self-insurance revolving fund, the 8 sulfur dioxide abatement account, the children's trust fund, the 9 Washington horse racing commission Washington bred owners' bonus fund 10 account, the Washington horse racing commission class C purse fund 11 account, the individual development account program account, the 12 Washington horse racing commission operating account (earnings from the 13 Washington horse racing commission operating account must be credited 14 to the Washington horse racing commission class C purse fund account), 15 16 the life sciences discovery fund, the Washington state heritage center 17 account, and the reading achievement account. However, the earnings to be distributed shall first be reduced by the allocation to the state 18 treasurer's service fund pursuant to RCW 43.08.190. 19

(c) The following accounts and funds shall receive eighty percent 20 of their proportionate share of earnings based upon each account's or 21 22 fund's average daily balance for the period: The advanced right-of-way 23 revolving fund, the advanced environmental mitigation revolving 24 account, the city and county advance right-of-way revolving fund, the 25 federal narcotics asset forfeitures account, the high occupancy vehicle local rail service assistance account, 26 account, the and the 27 miscellaneous transportation programs account.

(5) In conformance with Article II, section 37 of the state
 Constitution, no trust accounts or funds shall be allocated earnings
 without the specific affirmative directive of this section.

31 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 11. Sections 1 through 7 of this act constitute 32 a new chapter in Title 28B RCW.

33 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 12. If specific funding for the purposes of 34 this act, referencing this act by bill or chapter number, is not 35 provided by June 30, 2008, in the omnibus appropriations act, this act 36 is null and void." On page 1, line 1 of the title, after "program;" strike the remainder of the title and insert "amending RCW 28B.95.060; reenacting and amending RCW 43.79A.040; adding a new section to chapter 28B.95 RCW; adding a new chapter to Title 28B RCW; creating a new section; and providing expiration dates."
