1 On page 8, after line 7, insert the following:

2 "Sec. 10. RCW 28B.118.010 and 2007 c 405 s 2 are each amended to 3 read as follows:

The higher education coordinating board shall design the Washington college bound scholarship program in accordance with this section.

(1) "Eligible students" are those students who qualify for free or
reduced-price lunches. If a student qualifies in the seventh grade,
the student remains eligible even if the student does not receive free
or reduced-price lunches thereafter.

10 (2) Eligible students shall be notified of their eligibility for 11 the Washington college bound scholarship program beginning in their 12 seventh grade year. Students shall also be notified of the 13 requirements for award of the scholarship.

14 (3) To be eligible for a Washington college bound scholarship, a 15 student must sign a pledge during seventh or eighth grade that includes 16 a commitment to graduate from high school with at least a C average and with no felony convictions. Students who were in the eighth grade 17 during the 2007-08 school year may sign the pledge during the 2008-09 18 school year. The pledge must be witnessed by a parent or guardian and 19 20 forwarded to the higher education coordinating board by mail or 21 electronically, as indicated on the pledge form.

(4)(a) Scholarships shall be awarded to eligible students graduating from public high schools, approved private high schools under chapter 28A.195 RCW, or who received home-based instruction under chapter 28A.200 RCW.

(b) To receive the Washington college bound scholarship, a student must graduate with at least a "C" average from a public high school or an approved private high school under chapter 28A.195 RCW in Washington or have received home-based instruction under chapter 28A.200 RCW, must have no felony convictions, and must be a resident student as defined
 in RCW 28B.15.012(2) (a) through (d).

3 (5) A student's family income will be assessed upon graduation4 before awarding the scholarship.

(6) If at graduation from high school the student's family income
does not exceed sixty-five percent of the state median family income,
scholarship award amounts shall be as provided in this section.

8 (a) For students attending two or four-year institutions of higher 9 education as defined in RCW 28B.10.016, the value of the award shall be 10 (i) the difference between the student's tuition and required fees, 11 less the value of any state-funded grant, scholarship, or waiver 12 assistance the student receives; (ii) plus five hundred dollars for 13 books and materials.

(b) For students attending private four-year institutions of higher education in Washington, the award amount shall be the representative average of awards granted to students in public research universities in Washington.

18 (c) For students attending private vocational schools in 19 Washington, the award amount shall be the representative average of 20 awards granted to students in public community and technical colleges 21 in Washington.

(7) Recipients may receive no more than four full-time years' worthof scholarship awards.

(8) Institutions of higher education shall award the student all need-based and merit-based financial aid for which the student would otherwise qualify. The Washington college bound scholarship is intended to replace unmet need, loans, and, at the student's option, work-study award before any other grants or scholarships are reduced.

29 (9) The first scholarships shall be awarded to students graduating 30 in 2012.

(10) The state of Washington retains legal ownership of tuition units awarded as scholarships under this chapter until the tuition units are redeemed. These tuition units shall remain separately held from any tuition units owned under chapter 28B.95 RCW by a Washington college bound scholarship recipient.

(11) The scholarship award must be used within five years of
 receipt. Any unused scholarship tuition units revert to the Washington
 college bound scholarship account.

1 (12) Should the recipient terminate his or her enrollment for any 2 reason during the academic year, the unused portion of the scholarship 3 tuition units shall revert to the Washington college bound scholarship 4 account."

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5 On page 2, line 2 of the title, after "28A.165.035" insert "and 6 28B.118.010"

<u>EFFECT:</u> Students who are in the 8th grade during the College Bound Scholarship's first year will have two years within which to learn about and sign up for the scholarship, as is already allowed for students in all subsequent years.

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
