Background:

Washington operates on a biennial budget cycle. The Legislature authorizes expenditures for capital needs in the Capital Budget for a two-year period, and authorizes bond sales through

passage of a bond bill associated with the Capital Budget to fund a portion of these expenditures. The current Capital Budget covers the period from July 1, 2007 through June 30, 2009.

Summary of Engrossed Substitute Bill:

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Supplemental appropriations are made for the 2007-09 biennium of \$110.5 million. (See budget highlights.) State bond appropriations of \$6.6 million for vocational skills centers requires the passage of a bond authorization bill.

EFFECT OF SENATE AMENDMENT(S):

The amendment adds several projects, changes the amounts of several projects, and amends several conditions and limitations.

Appropriation: The sum of \$110.5 million in appropriations for the 2007-09 biennium from various fund sources.

Fiscal Note: Not requested.
