11 WHEREAS, Lloyd Meeds died at his Church Creek, Maryland home on 12 August 17, 2005; and

WHEREAS, Lloyd Meeds devoted his life to his wife of more than 35 years, Mary, and his three children and eight grandchildren;

NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that the United States Department of the Interior commence proceedings to dedicate a portal facility at the Alpine Lakes Wilderness Area in honor of Lloyd Meeds.
