1 TO THE HONORABLE GEORGE W. BUSH, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, 2 AND TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF 3 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 4 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED:

5 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of 6 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully 7 represent and petition as follows:

8 WHEREAS, Since early 2003, a conflict between forces of the 9 Government of the Republic of Sudan and rebel forces in the 10 impoverished Darfur region of western Sudan has resulted in attacks by 11 government allied militia and ground and air forces of the Government 12 of Sudan against civilians and undefended villages in the region; and

WHEREAS, The militia forces backed by the Government of Sudan have also engaged in the use of rape as a weapon of war, the abduction of children, the destruction of food and water sources, and the deliberate and systematic manipulation and denial of humanitarian assistance for the people of the Darfur region; and

18 WHEREAS, To date, over 400,000 Darfuri civilians have died and more 19 than 2.5 million have been displaced, forced to live in refugee and 20 displaced persons camps; and

WHEREAS, On December 18, 2003, United Nations Undersecretary-1 2 General for Humanitarian Affairs, Jan Egeland, declared that the Darfur region was probably "the world's worst humanitarian catastrophe," and 3 in April 2004 reported to the United Nations Security Council that in 4 Darfur, "a sequence of deliberate actions has been observed that seem 5 aimed at achieving a specific objective: The forcible and long-term 6 7 displacement of the targeted communities which may also be termed 'ethnic cleansing'"; and 8

9 WHEREAS, Doctors Without Borders, the Nobel Peace Prize-winning 10 medical humanitarian relief organization and one of the few aid groups 11 on the ground in the Darfur region, reported that the region is the 12 scene of "catastrophic mortality rates"; and

WHEREAS, On June 24, 2004, the Committee on Conscience of the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum declared a "genocide emergency" in the Darfur Region of Sudan; and

16 WHEREAS, On July 22, 2004, the United States Congress passed 17 resolutions declaring genocide in Darfur, Sudan; and

WHEREAS, On January 25, 2005, the United Nations Commission of 18 Inquiry declared that, "government forces and militias conducted 19 indiscriminate attacks, including killing of civilians, torture, 20 21 enforced disappearances, destruction of villages, rape and other forms 22 of sexual violence, pillaging, and forced displacement throughout These acts were conducted on a widespread and systematic 23 Darfur. 24 basis. The vast majority of the victims of all of these violations 25 have been from the Fur, Zaghawa, Massalit, Jebel, Aranga, and other socalled 'African' tribes"; and 26

27 WHEREAS, Since May 5, 2006, when the Darfur Peace Agreement was 28 signed by the government of Sudan, there has been no cessation of the 29 aforementioned violence against the civilians of Darfur; and

30 WHEREAS, On August 31, 2006, the United Nations Security Council 31 passed Resolution 1706 to expand the United Nations Mission in Sudan 32 (UNMIS) to deploy through the United Nations more peacekeepers as well 33 as to enhance their mandate to permit protection of civilians; and

34 WHEREAS, The Government of Sudan has consistently continued to 35 refuse to permit deployment of peacekeepers in Darfur, to ensure access 36 to humanitarian aid, to ensure safety for aid workers in Darfur, and to 37 ensure cessation of violence in the Darfur Region and has even expanded attacks into neighboring countries of Chad and The Central African
 Republic;

NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that the President of the United States use all political and economic means necessary to bring about a peaceful solution to the crisis and stop the deaths of thousands of innocent people every day, including:

7 (1) Calling on the Government of Sudan to grant permission for
8 deployment of peacekeepers in fulfillment of United Nations Resolution
9 1706;

10 (2) Calling on the Government of Sudan to grant unconditional and 11 immediate access to Darfur to humanitarian aid organizations and the 12 human rights investigation and humanitarian teams of the United 13 Nations;

14 (3) Encouraging the Administrator of the United States Agency for
15 International Development to work with donors to develop a plan to
16 preposition and deliver humanitarian assistance to Darfur, including a
17 plan for delivery of food by air if necessary;

18 (4) Directing the Secretary of State to develop a plan for further 19 bilateral and multilateral action in the event the Government of Sudan 20 fails to immediately undertake the actions called for in this Memorial, 21 including consideration of implementing a "no-fly" zone to protect 22 civilians and aid workers; and

(5) Directing the United States Representative to the UnitedNations to:

(a) Seek an official investigation by the United Nations to
determine if crimes against humanity have been committed by the
Government of Sudan in the Darfur region;

(b) Work with the international community to ensure that the individuals responsible for crimes against humanity in Darfur are accountable for their actions; and

31 (c) Provide an effective system to ensure that witnesses and 32 victims are protected during the process of fact-finding and evidence-33 gathering in the investigation of human rights abuses.

34 BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately 35 transmitted to the Honorable George W. Bush, President of the United 36 States, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the
