1 AN ACT Relating to improving the coordination of marine protected 2 areas in Washington; and creating new sections.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

Sec. 1. 4 NEW SECTION. The legislature finds that Washington 5 contains an array of marine protected areas managed by state, federal, 6 tribal, and local governments. The many entities managing marine 7 protected areas have developed distinct goals for protected areas, 8 criteria for protected area establishment, management practices, 9 terminology, and monitoring practices for these areas. The legislature 10 supports all efforts to protect, conserve, and sustainably manage However, the legislature finds that 11 marine life and resources. 12 additional coordination between marine protected areas managers will 13 improve the collective resource protection capacity of marine protected areas in Washington. The legislature further finds that additional 14 15 coordination between state agencies and local governments and citizens 16 will increase local involvement in, and the success of, marine 17 protected areas.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. (1) The marine protected areas work group is
 established. The work group shall:

3 (a) Examine the current inventory and management of Washington's
4 marine protected areas;

5 (b) Develop recommendations to improve coordination and consistency 6 among marine protected areas and marine protected areas managers 7 regarding goals for protected areas, criteria for protected area 8 establishment, management practices, terminology, and monitoring 9 practices;

10 (c) Develop recommendations to improve the integration of science 11 into marine protected area establishment and management decisions;

12 (d) Develop recommendations to further integrate local governments 13 and nongovernmental organizations into the establishment and management 14 of marine protected areas; and

(e) Provide any other recommendations to improve the effectivenessof marine protected areas in Washington.

(2) The director of fish and wildlife, or the director's designee, 17 shall chair the work group. The chair shall invite representatives of 18 state agencies and local governments with jurisdiction over or that 19 manage marine protected areas in Washington to participate in the work 20 21 These entities must include, but are not limited to, the group. 22 department of fish and wildlife, the department of natural resources, the state parks and recreation commission, and appropriate marine 23 24 resources committees. The chair shall invite representatives of 25 appropriate federal agencies and tribal governments to participate in the work group. The chair may also invite other appropriate state 26 27 agencies to participate in the work group. The chair is responsible for convening the work group and for directing the work of the work 28 State agencies invited to participate in the work group must 29 group. participate and work cooperatively with the department of fish and 30 wildlife to carry out this act. 31

32 (3) For the purposes of this section, "marine protected area" means
 33 a geographic marine or estuarine area designated by a state, federal,
 34 tribal, or local government in order to provide long-term protection
 35 for part or all of the resources within that area.

36 (4) By December 1, 2009, the work group must provide the 37 appropriate committees of the legislature with: (a) An inventory of

1 marine protected areas in Washington; and (b) a summary of the issues 2 and recommendations identified under subsection (1)(b) through (e) of 3 this section.

MEW SECTION. Sec. 3. (1) If chapter . . . (Substitute Senate Bill No. 6307), Laws of 2008 or a subsequent version thereof, becomes law, the marine protected areas work group established under section 2 of this act must focus its efforts on marine protected areas in coastal waters as defined in RCW 43.143.020.

9 (2) If chapter . . . (Substitute Senate Bill No. 6307), Laws of 10 2008 or a subsequent version thereof, does not become law, the marine 11 protected areas work group established under section 2 of this act must 12 focus its efforts on all marine waters of the state. The marine 13 protected areas work group and the Puget Sound partnership must work 14 jointly to carry out section 2 of this act regarding marine protected 15 areas in Puget Sound as defined in RCW 90.71.010.
