## <u>SHB 2363</u> - S COMM AMD By Committee on Ways & Means

## ADOPTED AS AMENDED 4/26/2009

Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the following:

"Sec. 1. RCW 28A.400.205 and 2003 1st sp.s. c 20 s 1 are each amended to read as follows:

5 (1) School district employees shall be provided an annual salary 6 cost-of-living increase in accordance with this section.

7 (a) The cost-of-living increase shall be calculated by applying 8 the rate of the yearly increase in the cost-of-living index to any 9 state-funded salary base used in state funding formulas for teachers 10 and other school district employees. Beginning with the 2001-02 11 school year, and for each subsequent school year, except for the 12 ((2003-04)) 2009-10 and ((2004-05)) 2010-11 school years, each school 13 district shall be provided a cost-of-living allocation sufficient to 14 grant this cost-of-living increase.

15 (b) A school district shall distribute its cost-of-living 16 allocation for salaries and salary-related benefits in accordance with 17 the district's salary schedules, collective bargaining agreements, and 18 compensation policies. No later than the end of the school year, each 19 school district shall certify to the superintendent of public 20 instruction that it has spent funds provided for cost-of-living 21 increases on salaries and salary-related benefits.

(c) Any funded cost-of-living increase shall be included in the aslary base used to determine cost-of-living increases for school employees in subsequent years. For teachers and other certificated instructional staff, the rate of the annual cost-of-living increase funded for certificated instructional staff shall be applied to the base salary used with the statewide salary allocation schedule 1 established under RCW 28A.150.410 and to any other salary models used 2 to recognize school district personnel costs.

3 (d) In addition to the cost-of-living allocations required by (a) 4 of this subsection, beginning in the 2011-2013 fiscal biennium and 5 thereafter the legislature shall provide on an expedited basis, to the 6 extent financially feasible, additional cost-of-living allocations 7 equal to what would have been received if cost-of-living allocations 8 had not been suspended during the 2009-10 or 2010-11 school year.

9 (2) For the purposes of this section, "cost-of-living index" 10 means, for any school year, the previous calendar year's annual 11 average consumer price index, using the official current base, 12 compiled by the bureau of labor statistics, United States department 13 of labor for the state of Washington. If the bureau of labor 14 statistics develops more than one consumer price index for areas 15 within the state, the index covering the greatest number of people, 16 covering areas exclusively within the boundaries of the state, and 17 including all items shall be used for the cost-of-living index in this 18 section.

20 Sec. 2. RCW 28B.50.465 and 2003 1st sp.s. c 20 s 3 are each 21 amended to read as follows:

(1) Academic employees of community and technical college districts shall be provided an annual salary cost-of-living increase in accordance with this section. For purposes of this section, "academic employee" has the same meaning as defined in RCW 28B.52.020. (a) Beginning with the 2001-2002 fiscal year, and for each subsequent fiscal year, except as provided in (d) of this subsection, each college district shall receive a cost-of-living allocation sufficient to increase academic employee salaries, including mandatory salary-related benefits, by the rate of the yearly increase in the cost-of-living index.

32 (b) A college district shall distribute its cost-of-living 33 allocation for salaries and salary-related benefits in accordance with 34 the district's salary schedules, collective bargaining agreements, and

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1 other compensation policies. No later than the end of the fiscal 2 year, each college district shall certify to the college board that it 3 has spent funds provided for cost-of-living increases on salaries and 4 salary-related benefits.

5 (c) The college board shall include any funded cost-of-living 6 increase in the salary base used to determine cost-of-living increases 7 for academic employees in subsequent years.

8 (d) Beginning with the 2001-2002 fiscal year, and for each 9 subsequent fiscal year except for the ((<del>2003-04</del>)) <u>2009-2010</u> and 10 ((<del>2004-05</del>)) <u>2010-2011</u> fiscal years, the state shall fully fund the 11 cost-of-living increase set forth in this section.

12 (e) In addition to the cost-of-living allocations required by (a) of 13 this subsection, beginning in the 2011-2013 fiscal biennium and 14 thereafter the legislature shall provide on an expedited basis, to the 15 extent financially feasible, additional cost-of-living allocations 16 equal to what would have been received if cost-of-living allocations 17 had not been suspended during the 2009-10 or 2010-11 school year.

18 (2) For the purposes of this section, "cost-of-living index" 19 means, for any fiscal year, the previous calendar year's annual 20 average consumer price index, using the official current base, 21 compiled by the bureau of labor statistics, United States department 22 of labor for the state of Washington. If the bureau of labor 23 statistics develops more than one consumer price index for areas 24 within the state, the index covering the greatest number of people, 25 covering areas exclusively within the boundaries of the state, and 26 including all items shall be used for the cost-of-living index in this 27 section.

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29 **Sec. 3.** RCW 28B.50.468 and 2003 1st sp.s. c 20 s 4 are each 30 amended to read as follows:

31 (1) Classified employees of technical colleges shall be provided 32 an annual salary cost-of-living increase in accordance with this 33 section. For purposes of this section, "technical college" has the 34 same meaning as defined in RCW 28B.50.030. This section applies to

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1 only those classified employees under the jurisdiction of chapter 2 41.56 RCW.

3 (a) Beginning with the 2001-2002 fiscal year, and for each 4 subsequent fiscal year, except as provided in (d) of this subsection, 5 each technical college board of trustees shall receive a cost-of-6 living allocation sufficient to increase classified employee salaries, 7 including mandatory salary-related benefits, by the rate of the yearly 8 increase in the cost-of-living index.

9 (b) A technical college board of trustees shall distribute its 10 cost-of-living allocation for salaries and salary-related benefits in 11 accordance with the technical college's salary schedules, collective 12 bargaining agreements, and other compensation policies. No later than 13 the end of the fiscal year, each technical college shall certify to 14 the college board that it has spent funds provided for cost-of-living 15 increases on salaries and salary-related benefits.

16 (c) The college board shall include any funded cost-of-living 17 increase in the salary base used to determine cost-of-living increases 18 for technical college classified employees in subsequent years.

19 (d) Beginning with the 2001-2002 fiscal year, and for each 20 subsequent fiscal year except for the ((2003-2004)) 2009-2010 and 21 ((2004-2005)) 2010-2011 fiscal years, the state shall fully fund the 22 cost-of-living increase set forth in this section.

(e) In addition to the cost-of-living allocations required by (a) of this subsection, beginning in the 2011-2013 fiscal biennium and thereafter the legislature shall provide on an expedited basis, to the extent financially feasible, additional cost-of-living allocations equal to what would have been received if cost-of-living allocations had not been suspended during the 2009-10 or 2010-11 school year.

29 (2) For the purposes of this section, "cost-of-living index" 30 means, for any fiscal year, the previous calendar year's annual 31 average consumer price index, using the official current base, 32 compiled by the bureau of labor statistics, United States department 33 of labor for the state of Washington. If the bureau of labor 34 statistics develops more than one consumer price index for areas

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within the state, the index covering the greatest number of people,
covering areas exclusively within the boundaries of the state, and
including all items shall be used for the cost-of-living index in this
section.

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6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. This act is necessary for the immediate 7 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the 8 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes 9 effect July 1, 2009."

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
