- 3 "Sec. 4. RCW 81.112.040 and 1994 c 109 s 1 are each amended to 4 read as follows:
- 5 (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, the 6 regional transit authority shall be governed by a board consisting of
- 7 representatives appointed by the county executive and confirmed by the 8 council or other legislative authority of each member county.
- 9 Membership shall be based on population from that portion of each
- 10 county which lies within the service area. Board members shall be
- 11 appointed initially on the basis of one for each one hundred forty-
- 12 five thousand population within the county. Such appointments shall
- 13 be made following consultation with city and town jurisdictions within
- 14 the service area. In addition, the secretary of transportation or the
- 15 secretary's designee shall serve as a member of the board and may have
- 16 voting status with approval of a majority of the other members of the
- 17 board. Only board members, not including alternates or designees, may
- 18 cast votes.
- 19 Each member of the board, except the secretary of transportation
- 20 or the secretary's designee, shall be:
- 21 (a) An elected official who serves on the legislative authority of
- 22 a city or as mayor of a city within the boundaries of the authority;
- 23 (b) On the legislative authority of the county, if fifty percent
- 24 of the population of the legislative official's district is within the
- 25 authority boundaries; or
- 26 (c) A county executive from a member county within the authority
- 27 boundaries.

- 1 When making appointments, each county executive shall ensure that
- 2 representation on the board includes an elected city official
- 3 representing the largest city in each county and assures proportional
- 4 representation from other cities, and representation from
- 5 unincorporated areas of each county within the service area. At least
- 6 one-half of all appointees from each county shall serve on the
- 7 governing authority of a public transportation system.
- 8 Members appointed from each county shall serve staggered four-year
- 9 terms. Vacancies shall be filled by appointment for the remainder of
- 10 the unexpired term of the position being vacated.
- 11 The governing board shall be reconstituted, with regard to the
- 12 number of representatives from each county, on a population basis,
- 13 using the official office of financial management population
- 14 estimates, five years after its initial formation and, at minimum, in
- 15 the year following each official federal census. The board membership
- 16 may be reduced, maintained, or expanded to reflect population changes
- 17 but under no circumstances may the board membership exceed twenty-
- 18 five.
- 19 (2) There is one nonvoting member of the regional transit
- 20 authority board. The nonvoting member is recommended by the labor
- 21 organization representing the majority of the public transportation
- 22 employees within the regional transit authority. The nonvoting member
- 23 is appointed for a term of four years. The chair or cochairs of the
- 24 board shall exclude the nonvoting member from attending any executive
- 25 session held for the purpose of discussing negotiations with labor
- 26 organizations. The chair or cochairs may exclude the nonvoting member
- 27 from attending any other executive session.
- 28 $((\frac{2}{1}))$ (3) Major decisions of the authority shall require a
- 29 favorable vote of two-thirds of the entire membership of the voting
- 30 members. "Major decisions" include at least the following: System
- 31 plan adoption and amendment; system phasing decisions; annual budget
- 32 adoption; authorization of annexations; modification of board
- 33 composition; and executive director employment.

 $\overline{\text{EFFECT:}}$ Requires a Regional Transit Authority governing board to have a nonvoting labor representative.
