Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the following:

3 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. (1) The legislature finds that:

4 (a) Health care spending in the state and nationally is rising
5 rapidly. In 2010, health care expenditures will comprise more than
6 seventeen percent of the nation's gross domestic product;

7 (b) Health care spending is growing as a percentage of Washington 8 state's budget. From 2000 to 2007, health care expenditures have 9 increased from twenty-two percent to twenty-nine percent of the state 10 budget. This rapid rise in expenditures is competing with other needed 11 services, including K-12 education;

12 (c) The legislature appropriates over one billion dollars per year 13 to support the benefits for K-12 employees. However, there is very 14 little transparency or accountability for how those benefit dollars are 15 spent; and

16 (d) Purchasing of health benefits for school employees is 17 decentralized and is managed by individual school districts and 18 educational service districts, resulting in additional administrative 19 costs, duplicative efforts, and a fragmented purchasing pool.

20 (2) Therefore, the legislature intends to pursue streamlining the 21 purchasing and delivery of school district and educational service 22 district employee health care benefits. Centralized purchasing of 23 health benefits would provide administrative efficiencies while also 24 providing transparency and accountability for the benefit spending.

25 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. If established under Concurrent Resolution 26 8409 of the 2010 legislative session, the joint select committee on 27 health reform implementation may consider ways to streamline the 28 purchasing and delivery of school district and educational service 29 district employee health care benefits, including opportunities to 1 insert administrative efficiency, create transparency and 2 accountability for benefit spending, and create more equitable premium 3 contributions for employees with dependents. The joint select 4 committee may appoint an advisory committee for this purpose and may 5 review available data to inform its recommendations.

6 Sec. 3. RCW 28A.400.275 and 1990 1st ex.s. c 11 s 5 are each 7 amended to read as follows:

8 (1) Any contract for employee benefits executed after April 13, 9 1990, between a school district and a benefit provider or employee 10 bargaining unit is null and void unless it contains an agreement to 11 abide by state laws relating to school district employee benefits. The 12 term of the contract may not exceed one year.

(2) ((School-districts)) A health insurer, as defined in RCW 13 74.09A.010, providing or administering health care benefits for school 14 district or educational school district employees shall annually submit 15 to the Washington state health care authority summary descriptions of 16 17 all benefits offered under the district's employee benefit plan. The ((districts)) health insurer shall also submit data to the health care 18 authority specifying the total number of employees and, for each 19 20 employee, types of coverage or benefits received including numbers of 21 covered dependents, ((the number of eligible dependents,)) and the age and sex of the employee and each dependent. The health insurer in 22 23 coordination with the school district must submit the amount of the district's contribution, each bargaining group's pooling dollars 24 available per member, and additional premium costs paid by the employee 25 26 through payroll deductions((, and the age and sex of the employee and each-dependent)). The plan descriptions and the data shall be 27 submitted in a format and according to a schedule established by the 28 29 health care authority. The first submission of data from each health insurer must be provided by November 1, 2010. 30

31 (((3) Any benefit provider offering a benefit plan by contract with a school district under subsection (1) of this section shall agree to make available to the school district the benefit plan descriptions and, where available, the demographic information on plan subscribers that the district is required to report to the Washington state health care authority under this section. 1 (4) This section shall not apply to benefit plans offered in the
2 1989-90 school year.))"

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3 On page 1, line 2 of the title, after "employees;" strike the 4 remainder of the title and insert "amending RCW 28A.400.275; and 5 creating new sections."

EFFECT: Strikes the underlying bill, adds an intent section, requires the joint select committee on health care reform implementation to consider ways to streamline the purchasing and delivery of K-12 employee health care benefits; and replaces current reporting requirements with language requiring health insurers that provide or administer health benefits for K-12 employees to submit data.

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
