(1) The board of directors of the public facilities district shall 6 7 have authority to authorize the expenditure of funds for the public purposes of preparing and distributing information to the general 8 9 public and promoting, advertising, improving, developing, operating, and maintaining facilities of the district. For promotional activities 10 11 the district board must: (a) Identify the proposed expenditure in its annual budget; and (b) adopt written rules governing promotional 12 13 hosting by employees, agents, and the board, including requirements for identifying and evaluating the public benefits to be derived and 14 15 documenting the public benefits realized.
