- (1) Subject to subsection (4) of this section, it shall be the duty of the chief of the Washington state patrol to file, tabulate, and 8 9 analyze all accident reports and to publish annually, immediately 10 following the close of each fiscal year, and monthly during the course of the year, statistical information based thereon showing the number 11 of accidents, the location, the frequency, whether any driver involved 12 in the accident was distracted at the time of the accident and the 13 circumstances thereof, and other statistical information which may 14 prove of assistance in determining the cause of vehicular accidents.

- 16 However, the information described in this section must be compiled or
- collected solely for the purposes related to those identified in 23 17

(2) Distractions contributing to an accident to be reported must include at least the following: Not distracted; operating a handheld electronic telecommunication device; operating a hands-free wireless telecommunication device; other electronic devices (including, but not limited to, PDA's, laptop computers, navigational devices, etc.); adjusting an audio or entertainment system; smoking; eating or drinking; reading or writing; grooming; interacting with children, passengers, animals, or objects in the vehicle; other inside distractions; outside distractions; and distraction unknown.

(3) Such accident reports and analysis or reports thereof shall be available to the director of licensing, the department of transportation, the utilities and transportation commission, the traffic safety commission, and other public entities authorized by the chief of the Washington state patrol, or their duly authorized representatives, for further tabulation and analysis for pertinent data relating to the regulation of highway traffic, highway construction, vehicle operators and all other purposes, and to publish information so derived as may be deemed of publication value. However, any public entity listed in this subsection shall compile or collect the information described in this section solely for the purposes related to those identified in 23 U.S.C. Sec. 152 and 23 U.S.C. Sec. 409.

22 (4) Information compiled or collected under this section may be 23 released only in conformance with 23 U.S.C. Sec. 409.
