4 **sec. 1.** The Washington state legislature finds "NEW SECTION. 5 that for cancer patients, there is an inequity in how much they have 6 to pay toward the cost of a self administered oral medication and how 7 much they have to pay for an intravenous product that is administered 8 in a physician's office or clinic. The legislature further finds that 9 when these inequities exist, patients' access to medically necessary, 10 appropriate treatment is often unfairly restricted. The legislature 11 also acknowledges that self administered chemotherapy is the only 12 treatment for some types of cancer where there is no intravenous 13 alternative. The legislature declares that in order to reduce the 14 out-of-pocket costs for cancer patients whose diagnosis requires 15 treatment through self administered anticancer medication, the cost-16 sharing responsibilities for these patients must be on a basis at 17 least comparable to those of patients receiving intravenously 18 administered anticancer medication.

20 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 41.05 RCW 21 to read as follows:

(1) Each health plan offered to public employees and their covered dependents under this chapter, including those subject to the provision of Title 48 RCW, and is issued or renewed beginning January 1, 2012, and provides coverage for cancer chemotherapy treatment must provide coverage for prescribed, self administered anticancer medication that is used to kill or slow the growth of cancerous cells 1 on a basis at least comparable to cancer chemotherapy medications
2 administered by a health care provider or facility as defined in RCW
3 48.43.005(15) and (16).

4 (2) Nothing in this section may be interpreted to prohibit a 5 health plan from administering a formulary or preferred drug list, 6 requiring prior authorization, or imposing other appropriate 7 utilization controls in approving coverage for any chemotherapy.

9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 48.20 RCW 10 to read as follows:

11 (1) Each health plan issued or renewed on or after January 1, 12 2012, that provides coverage for cancer chemotherapy treatment must 13 provide coverage for prescribed, self administered anticancer 14 medication that is used to kill or slow the growth of cancerous cells 15 on a basis at least comparable to cancer chemotherapy medications 16 administered by a health care provider or facility as defined in RCW 17 48.43.005(15) and (16).

18 (2) Nothing in this section may be interpreted to prohibit a 19 health plan from administering a formulary or preferred drug list, 20 requiring prior authorization, or imposing other appropriate 21 utilization controls in approving coverage for any chemotherapy.

23 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** A new section is added to chapter 48.21 RCW 24 to read as follows:

(1) Each health plan issued or renewed on or after January 1, 26 2012, that provides coverage for cancer chemotherapy treatment must 27 provide coverage for prescribed, self administered anticancer 28 medication that is used to kill or slow the growth of cancerous cells 29 on a basis at least comparable to cancer chemotherapy medications 30 administered by a health care provider or facility as defined in RCW 31 48.43.005(15) and (16).

32 (2) Nothing in this section may be interpreted to prohibit a
 33 health plan from administering a formulary or preferred drug list,

1 requiring prior authorization, or imposing other appropriate
2 utilization controls in approving coverage for any chemotherapy.

4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. A new section is added to chapter 48.44 RCW 5 to read as follows:

6 (1) Each health plan issued or renewed on or after January 1, 7 2012, that provides coverage for cancer chemotherapy treatment must 8 provide coverage for prescribed, self administered anticancer 9 medication that is used to kill or slow the growth of cancerous cells 10 on a basis at least comparable to cancer chemotherapy medications 11 administered by a health care provider or facility as defined in RCW 12 48.43.005(15) and (16).

13 (2) Nothing in this section may be interpreted to prohibit a 14 health plan from administering a formulary or preferred drug list, 15 requiring prior authorization, or imposing other appropriate 16 utilization controls in approving coverage for any chemotherapy.

18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 6. A new section is added to chapter 48.46 RCW 19 to read as follows:

(1) Each health plan issued or renewed on or after January 1, 21 2012, that provides coverage for cancer chemotherapy treatment must 22 provide coverage for prescribed, self administered anticancer 23 medication that is used to kill or slow the growth of cancerous cells 24 on a basis at least comparable to cancer chemotherapy medications 25 administered by a health care provider or facility as defined in RCW 26 48.43.005(15) and (16).

(2) Nothing in this section may be interpreted to prohibit a kealth plan from administering a formulary or preferred drug list, prequiring prior authorization, or imposing other appropriate utilization controls in approving coverage for any chemotherapy."

EFFECT:

• Changes the category of medications to which the bill applies from "orally administered" medications to "self administered"

medications;

- Requires health plans to offer self administered drugs on a basis <u>at least comparable</u> to chemotherapy medications administered <u>by health providers or facilities</u> (the original bill required the medications to be offered on a <u>comparable</u> <u>basis</u> to chemotherapy medications administered <u>intravenously or</u> by injection); and
- Allows health plans to administer a formulary or preferred drug list.
