1 On page 5, beginning on line 1 of the amendment, strike all of  
2 section 2 and insert the following:

3 "Sec. 2. RCW 70.240.040 and 2008 c 288 s 5 are each amended to  
4 read as follows:

5 (1) Except as provided in subsection (3) of this section, beginning  
6 six months after the department has adopted rules ((under section 8(5)  
7 of this act)) identifying chemicals of high concern for children, a  
8 manufacturer of a children's product, or a trade organization on behalf  
9 of its member manufacturers, shall provide notice to the department  
10 that the manufacturer's product contains a high priority chemical. The  
11 notice must be filed annually with the department and must include the  
12 following information:

13 ((+1)) (a) The name of the chemical used or produced and its  
14 chemical abstracts service registry number;

15 ((+2)) (b) A brief description of the product or product component  
16 containing the substance;

17 ((+3)) (c) A description of the function of the chemical in the  
18 product or product component;

19 ((+4)) (d) The amount of the chemical used in each unit of the  
20 product or product component. The amount may be reported in ranges,  
21 rather than the exact amount;

22 ((+5)) (e) The name and address of the manufacturer and the name,  
23 address, and phone number of a contact person for the manufacturer; and

24 ((+6)) (f) Any other information the manufacturer deems relevant  
25 to the appropriate use of the product.

26 (2) Manufacturers may provide notification through a department-  
27 approved and certified third party.

28 (3) The requirements of this section only apply to chemicals in  
29 children's products in amounts greater than the de minimis level. De

1 de minimis level means a concentration of less than or equal to 0.1  
2 percent by weight of a finished product (one thousand parts per  
3 million)."

EFFECT: Specifies that the reporting requirements only apply to chemicals in children's products in amounts greater than the de minimis level. De minimis level means a concentration of less than or equal to 0.1 percent by weight of a finished product (one thousand parts per million).
