1            AN ACT Relating to common student identifiers for community and  
2 technical colleges; and amending RCW 28B.50.090.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4            **Sec. 1.** RCW 28B.50.090 and 2010 c 246 s 3 are each amended to read  
5 as follows:

6            The college board shall have general supervision and control over  
7 the state system of community and technical colleges. In addition to  
8 the other powers and duties imposed upon the college board by this  
9 chapter, the college board shall be charged with the following powers,  
10 duties and responsibilities:

11            (1) Review the budgets prepared by the boards of trustees, prepare  
12 a single budget for the support of the state system of community and  
13 technical colleges and adult education, and submit this budget to the  
14 governor as provided in RCW 43.88.090;

15            (2) Establish guidelines for the disbursement of funds; and receive  
16 and disburse such funds for adult education and maintenance and  
17 operation and capital support of the college districts in conformance  
18 with the state and district budgets, and in conformance with chapter  
19 43.88 RCW;

1 (3) Ensure, through the full use of its authority:

2 (a) That each college district, in coordination with colleges,  
3 within a regional area, shall offer thoroughly comprehensive  
4 educational, training, and service programs to meet the needs of both  
5 the communities and students served by combining high standards of  
6 excellence in academic transfer courses; realistic and practical  
7 courses in occupational education, both graded and ungraded; and  
8 community services of an educational, cultural, and recreational  
9 nature; and adult education, including basic skills and general,  
10 family, and workforce literacy programs and services;

11 (b) That each college district shall maintain an open-door policy,  
12 to the end that no student will be denied admission because of the  
13 location of the student's residence or because of the student's  
14 educational background or ability; that, insofar as is practical in the  
15 judgment of the college board, curriculum offerings will be provided to  
16 meet the educational and training needs of the community generally and  
17 the students thereof; and that all students, regardless of their  
18 differing courses of study, will be considered, known and recognized  
19 equally as members of the student body: PROVIDED, That the  
20 administrative officers of a community or technical college may deny  
21 admission to a prospective student or attendance to an enrolled student  
22 if, in their judgment, the student would not be competent to profit  
23 from the curriculum offerings of the college, or would, by his or her  
24 presence or conduct, create a disruptive atmosphere within the college  
25 not consistent with the purposes of the institution. This subsection  
26 (3)(b) shall not apply to competency, conduct, or presence associated  
27 with a disability in a person twenty-one years of age or younger  
28 attending a technical college;

29 (4) Prepare a comprehensive master plan for the development of  
30 community and technical college education and training in the state;  
31 and assist the office of financial management in the preparation of  
32 enrollment projections to support plans for providing adequate college  
33 facilities in all areas of the state. The master plan shall include  
34 implementation of the vision, goals, priorities, and strategies in the  
35 statewide strategic master plan for higher education under RCW  
36 28B.76.200 based on the community and technical college system's role  
37 and mission. The master plan shall also contain measurable performance

1 indicators and benchmarks for gauging progress toward achieving the  
2 goals and priorities;

3 (5) Define and administer criteria and guidelines for the  
4 establishment of new community and technical colleges or campuses  
5 within the existing districts;

6 (6) Establish criteria and procedures for modifying district  
7 boundary lines and consolidating district structures to form multiple  
8 campus districts consistent with the purposes set forth in RCW  
9 28B.50.020 as now or hereafter amended and in accordance therewith make  
10 such changes as it deems advisable;

11 (7) Establish minimum standards to govern the operation of the  
12 community and technical colleges with respect to:

13 (a) Qualifications and credentials of instructional and key  
14 administrative personnel, except as otherwise provided in the state  
15 plan for vocational education((~~τ~~))i

16 (b) Internal budgeting, accounting, auditing, and financial  
17 procedures as necessary to supplement the general requirements  
18 prescribed pursuant to chapter 43.88 RCW((~~τ~~))i

19 (c) The content of the curriculums and other educational and  
20 training programs, and the requirement for degrees and certificates  
21 awarded by the colleges((~~τ~~))i

22 (d) Standard admission policies((~~τ~~))i

23 (e) Eligibility of courses to receive state fund support; and

24 (f) Common student identifiers such that once a student has  
25 enrolled at any community or technical college he or she retains the  
26 same student identification upon transfer to any college district;

27 (8) Establish and administer criteria and procedures for all  
28 capital construction including the establishment, installation, and  
29 expansion of facilities within the various college districts;

30 (9) Encourage innovation in the development of new educational and  
31 training programs and instructional methods; coordinate research  
32 efforts to this end; and disseminate the findings thereof;

33 (10) Exercise any other powers, duties and responsibilities  
34 necessary to carry out the purposes of this chapter;

35 (11) Authorize the various community and technical colleges to  
36 offer programs and courses in other districts when it determines that  
37 such action is consistent with the purposes set forth in RCW 28B.50.020  
38 as now or hereafter amended;

1 (12) Notwithstanding any other law or statute regarding the sale of  
2 state property, sell or exchange and convey any or all interest in any  
3 community and technical college real and personal property, except such  
4 property as is received by a college district in accordance with RCW  
5 28B.50.140(8), when it determines that such property is surplus or that  
6 such a sale or exchange is in the best interests of the community and  
7 technical college system;

8 (13) In order that the treasurer for the state board for community  
9 and technical colleges appointed in accordance with RCW 28B.50.085 may  
10 make vendor payments, the state treasurer will honor warrants drawn by  
11 the state board providing for an initial advance on July 1, 1982, of  
12 the current biennium and on July 1 of each succeeding biennium from the  
13 state general fund in an amount equal to twenty-four percent of the  
14 average monthly allotment for such budgeted biennium expenditures for  
15 the state board for community and technical colleges as certified by  
16 the office of financial management; and at the conclusion of such  
17 initial month and for each succeeding month of any biennium, the state  
18 treasurer will reimburse expenditures incurred and reported monthly by  
19 the state board treasurer in accordance with chapter 43.88 RCW:  
20 PROVIDED, That the reimbursement to the state board for actual  
21 expenditures incurred in the final month of each biennium shall be less  
22 the initial advance made in such biennium;

23 (14) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (12) of this  
24 section, may receive such gifts, grants, conveyances, devises, and  
25 bequests of real or personal property from private sources as may be  
26 made from time to time, in trust or otherwise, whenever the terms and  
27 conditions thereof will aid in carrying out the community and technical  
28 college programs and may sell, lease or exchange, invest or expend the  
29 same or the proceeds, rents, profits and income thereof according to  
30 the terms and conditions thereof; and adopt regulations to govern the  
31 receipt and expenditure of the proceeds, rents, profits and income  
32 thereof; and

33 (15) The college board shall have the power of eminent domain.
