1 AN ACT Relating to encouraging patient self-determination and 2 health care planning by promoting the use of a form developed pursuant 3 to RCW 43.70.480; and amending RCW 43.70.480.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 Sec. 1. RCW 43.70.480 and 2000 c 70 s 1 are each amended to read 6 as follows:

7 (1) The department of health shall adopt guidelines and protocols 8 for how emergency medical personnel shall respond when summoned to the 9 site of an injury or illness for the treatment of a person who has 10 signed a written directive or durable power of attorney requesting that 11 he or she not receive futile emergency medical treatment. The 12 guidelines shall include development of a ((simple)) medical order form 13 that shall be used statewide.

14 (2) Any provider as defined in subsection (3)(a) (i), (ii), or (iii) of this section or any facility, who participates in the provision of medical care or in the withholding or withdrawal of lifesustaining treatment, or any provider defined in subsection (3)(a) (iv) or (v) of this section, who participates in the provision of or the withholding or withdrawal of life-sustaining treatment, in accordance

with the directions contained in the form developed under subsection 1 (1) of this section is immune from legal liability, including civil, 2 criminal, and professional conduct sanctions, as long as such 3 participation has been conducted in good faith, within the scope of his 4 or her credentials or employment, and is not found to be negligent 5 6 under chapter 7.70 RCW. 7 (3) For purposes of this section: (a) "Provider" includes: 8 9 (i) A physician licensed under chapter 18.71 RCW, an osteopathic physician licensed under chapter 18.57 RCW, an advanced registered 10 nurse practitioner licensed under chapter 18.79 RCW, a physician 11 assistant licensed under chapter 18.71A RCW, and an osteopathic 12 physician's assistant licensed under chapter 18.57A RCW; 13 (ii) Any credentialed health care provider acting under the 14 direction of an individual identified in (a)(i) of this subsection; 15 (iii) Any credentialed provider listed under RCW 18.71.210; 16 (iv) Any credentialed provider regulated under chapter 18.130 RCW; 17 18 and 19 (v) Any long-term care worker exempted from certification 20 requirements under RCW 18.88B.041(1). 21 (b) "Facility" includes a hospital licensed under chapter 70.41 RCW, a nursing home licensed under chapter 18.51 RCW, a home care 22 agency, a home health agency or hospice agency licensed under chapter 23 24 70.127 RCW, a community residential services business established under chapter 71A.10 RCW, an assisted living facility licensed under chapter 25 26 18.20 RCW, an adult family home licensed under chapter 70.128 RCW, an 27 institution licensed under chapter 71.12 RCW, a state hospital designated under chapter 72.23 RCW, a clinic that is part of a 28 community mental health service delivery system established under 29 chapter 71.24 RCW, a long-term care facility as defined in RCW 30 43.190.020, any state veterans' home established under chapter 72.36 31 RCW, any entity identified in RCW 18.71.210, and any kidney disease 32 33 treatment center. 34 (4) Nothing in this chapter may be interpreted to change the standard of care with respect to: (a) Health care provided in 35 36 accordance with a directive under chapter 70.122 RCW; or (b) persons

- 2 patient who is not competent to consent under RCW 7.70.065.

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
