1 AN ACT Relating to encouraging patient self-determination and 2 health care planning by promoting the use of a form developed pursuant 3 to RCW 43.70.480; and amending RCW 43.70.480.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 Sec. 1. RCW 43.70.480 and 2000 c 70 s 1 are each amended to read 6 as follows:

7 (1) The department of health shall adopt guidelines and protocols 8 for how emergency medical personnel shall respond when summoned to the 9 site of an injury or illness for the treatment of a person who has 10 signed a written directive or durable power of attorney requesting that 11 he or she not receive futile emergency medical treatment. The 12 guidelines shall include development of a ((simple)) medical order form 13 that shall be used statewide.

14 (2) Any provider as defined in (a)(i), (ii), or (iii) of this 15 subsection or any facility, who participates in the provision of 16 medical care or in the withholding or withdrawal of life-sustaining 17 treatment, or any provider defined in (a)(iv) of this subsection, who 18 participates in the provision of or the withholding or withdrawal of 19 life-sustaining treatment, in accordance with the directions contained

1	in the form developed under subsection (1) of this section is immune
2	from legal liability, including civil, criminal, and professional
3	conduct sanctions, as long as such participation has been conducted in
4	good faith, within the scope of his or her credentials, and is not
5	found to be negligent under chapter 7.70 RCW.
6	(3) For purposes of this section:
7	<u>(a) "Provider" includes:</u>
8	(i) A physician licensed under chapter 18.71 RCW, an osteopathic
9	physician licensed under chapter 18.57 RCW, an advanced registered
10	nurse practitioner licensed under chapter 18.79 RCW, a physician
11	assistant licensed under chapter 18.71A RCW, and an osteopathic
12	physician's assistant licensed under chapter 18.57A RCW;
13	(ii) Any credentialed health care provider acting under the
14	direction of an individual identified in (a)(i) of this subsection;
15	(iii) Any credentialed provider listed under RCW 18.71.210; and
16	(iv) Any credentialed provider regulated under chapter 18.130 RCW;
17	or
18	(v) Any long-term care worker exempted from certification
19	requirements under RCW 18.88B.041(1).
20	(b) "Facility" includes a hospital licensed under chapter 70.41
21	RCW, a nursing home licensed under chapter 18.51 RCW, a home health
22	agency or hospice agency licensed under chapter 70.127 RCW, an assisted
23	living facility licensed under chapter 18.20 RCW, an adult family home
24	licensed under chapter 70.128 RCW, an institution licensed under
25	chapter 71.12 RCW, a state hospital designated under chapter 72.23 RCW,
26	a clinic that is part of a community mental health service delivery
27	system established under chapter 71.24 RCW, a long-term care facility
28	as defined in RCW 43.190.020, any state veterans' home established
29	under chapter 72.36 RCW, any entity identified in RCW 18.71.210, and
30	any kidney disease treatment center.
31	(4) Nothing in this chapter may be interpreted to change the
32	standard of care with respect to: (a) Health care provided in
33	accordance with a directive under chapter 70.122 RCW or (b) persons
34	authorized to provide informed consent to health care on behalf of a
35	patient who is not competent to consent under RCW 7.70.065.

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
