## SENATE BILL 5726

AN ACT Relating to geographic limitations on local paid sick leave and paid safe leave programs; adding a new section to chapter 35.21 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 35A.21 RCW; and adding a new section to chapter 36.01 RCW.

- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 35.21 RCW 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (1) No city or town may apply a paid sick leave or paid safe leave 9 program to:
- 10 (a) An employer whose principal place of business is outside the limits of the city or town's territorial jurisdiction; or
- (b) An employee whose principal place of employment is outside the limits of the city or town's territorial jurisdiction regardless of whether the employer's principal place of business is within the city or town's territorial jurisdiction.
- 16 (2) Any ordinance, code, regulation, or rule enacted on or after 17 the effective date of this section, or in effect on the effective date 18 of this section, is unenforceable with respect to an employer whose 19 principal place of business is outside the limits of the city or town's

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- territorial jurisdiction or to an employee whose principal place of employment is outside the limits of the city or town's territorial jurisdiction.
  - (3) For purposes of this section:

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- (a) "Paid sick leave" means paid leave:
- (i) Due to the employee's mental or physical illness, injury, or health condition; need for medical diagnosis, care, or treatment of a mental or physical illness, injury, or health condition; or need for preventive medical care; or
- (ii) To allow the employee to provide care of a family member with a mental or physical illness, injury, or health condition; who needs medical diagnosis, care, or treatment of a mental or physical illness, injury, or health condition; or who needs preventive medical care.

- 29 (b) An employee whose principal place of employment is outside the 30 limits of the code city's territorial jurisdiction regardless of 31 whether the employer's principal place of business is within the code 32 city's territorial jurisdiction.

- 29 (b) An employee whose principal place of employment is outside the 30 limits of the county's territorial jurisdiction regardless of whether 31 the employer's principal place of business is within the county's 32 territorial jurisdiction.
- 33 (2) Any ordinance, code, regulation, or rule enacted on or after 34 the effective date of this section, or in effect on the effective date 35 of this section, is unenforceable with respect to an employer whose 36 principal place of business is outside the limits of the county's
