1 AN ACT Relating to creating a teen summer employment wage; and 2 adding new sections to chapter 49.46 RCW.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 49.46 RCW 5 to read as follows:

The legislature finds that the teen employment rate in Washington б 7 is consistently lower than the national rate. The legislature further finds that while the employment rate for teens increases during the 8 9 summer, a seasonal teen wage would further increase the teen employment rate and would help a greater number of teens develop valuable work 10 11 skills and experience and create a work ethic that will carry throughout the teen's working life. The legislature therefore intends 12 13 maximize teen summer employment by creating a seasonal wage to 14 applicable to new employees age fourteen to nineteen who are employed 15 during the summer months.

16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 49.46 RCW 17 to read as follows:

18 Employers may pay teen wages to new employees fourteen to nineteen

years of age at the minimum wage rate established in section 206, subsection (a)(1) of the federal fair labor standards act. Teen wages can only be paid to those new employees hired on a temporary or seasonal basis, and for work performed during the period starting the first day of June and ending the last day of August.
